



### ***Great Bulkington Railway July 4<sup>th</sup> 2009***

Greetings to all our passengers. We are very pleased to advise that the Great Bulkington Railway will be offering train rides to young and not so young on July 4<sup>th</sup> (American Independence Day) from 1330 hrs until 1630 hrs.

The event is in aid of a worthy charity called ‘Women for Women’ (292518) which is headed up by Lord Professor Robert Winston who also heads up the Institute of Obstetrics and Gynaecology Trust at the Imperial College London. This charity raises funds to research the cause and treatment of miscarriage, childhood cancer, genetic diseases and infertility. We expect to have a cake stall, strawberries and cream, with cold drinks, teas and coffee. The railway is located next to Bulkington Village Hall and has around 1000 feet of track, ride on carriages, signals and a tunnel.

## **CLUB AND ORGANISATION NEWS**

### **SEEND AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB**

For the big event of June – our trip to Highgrove - we had the most glorious, hot, sunny day, almost too hot, but not humid which always helps, and the day did not disappoint. The organisation there is smooth, efficient and very polite, from the armed policeman who welcomes you at the gate, the smartly dressed gentleman who welcomes you at the visitor centre to the volunteer guide and the ladies who serve the tea. Nevertheless you do exactly what you are told, leave cameras and phones on the coach and don't alight from the coach until you are told. There were, I think, four other parties there but we hardly caught a glimpse because we were timed so well.



The garden is, of course, run on organic lines and is full of birds and wildlife and seems to be a serene and timeless landscape. Nothing jars or looks out of place, it is not as manicured as you might expect, no sweeping lawns mown in lines, but a series of small gardens that run into each other, often connected by the wildflower meadow. This was beautifully in flower although we were too late for the tulips and the alliums were at the seedhead stage. There are many quirky buildings and features and numerous carefully arranged groups of large pots. Prince Charles holds a National Collection of hostas in the Stumpery and keeps some old species of orchard trees for Brogdale. Each tree is very simply planted round by lavender in mown grass rather than the usual orchard long grass. The tour lasted two hours, followed by tea and a visit to the shop and

then we went into Tetbury, although we were behind schedule by then so we had to choose between lunch and shopping, a hard decision.

Our next trip for a very select group is to West Woodhay House Flower Show on 20th June.

Our day trip to Dorset and Somerset is on 18th July. Please gather at The Bell lay-by at 9.15 am, ready to leave at 9.30am. Coffee will be provided at Hilltop Nursery. You will need a picnic lunch to eat at Snape Cottage. Tea will be available at East Lambrook Manor, (not included in the cost of the trip). There are still a few places left if you wish to go. ## **SEEND SHUTTLE**



### **The AGM**

Most of the Seend Community Bus Committee, a few of the regular drivers and a handful of other supporters attended the Shuttle AGM on 11th June.

The chairman, Peter Wallis, talked of our cooperation with the village of Bromham - which provides several drivers and some funding - and the problem of finding new drivers to replace those now approaching the age of 75, which is the cut-off age for insuring our volunteer drivers. After 17 years of operation, many of the same people are still involved. Private hirers are encouraged to find their own drivers, whom Peter takes on a test run. Many car journeys are saved by the Shuttle. The Tuesday service into Melksham is not very well supported; we don't know why. But the Thursday route into Devizes via Bromham is very popular. The school run continues to be well used. There has been some minor damage to the bus, possibly happening in the car park. It will be repaired, but it is difficult to find time for this because of the bus's busy schedule. Peter thanked the volunteers and Committee members for their work during the year, singling out Alison Cobbing for a special mention as she deals with the arduous jobs of taking private-hire bookings and organizing the drivers' rota.

Ownership of the Shuttle is being transferred to the Parish Council (it was previously technically owned by Kennet District Council). Day-to-day running of the service will continue to be the responsibility of the Committee.

Treasurer Terry Sleightholme reported a successful year financially, with the income from private hire still subsidising the scheduled services.

## **BITS'N'BOBS**

### **PETITION FOR TRAFFIC CALMING**

First of all I should like to thank all those who signed my petition for some form of traffic calming in the High Street. It was sent off to the Wiltshire Council (copy to our Parish Council) in the middle of May and I received a reply almost by return. By the third week of May the Police had established a survey to record the speed of all vehicles travelling along the High Street. The survey lasted for one week and on 30<sup>th</sup> May I received their results. I should like to congratulate all concerned on the speed with which they reacted.

Unfortunately, I believe that the rubber strips laid across the road for the survey constituted a form of traffic calming in themselves, and I saw many drivers slow down when they saw them. However the results achieved were quite dramatic:

- Number of vehicles checked 47,302
- Number exceeding speed limit (by any amount, even 1mph) 22,383
- Number exceeding speed limit by enough to be prosecuted 5,677

The average speed of all those checked was 33.76mph. This doesn't sound too bad until you realise that theoretically, it only needs seven vehicles travelling at 30mph to allow one vehicle to travel at 60mph and still achieve this average. If this had happened, it would mean that, over the week, there would have been 5,913 vehicles travelling at 60mph. This would be 845 per day or 35 every hour of every day and every night!!

Quite obviously this would be a worst case scenario and didn't happen, but I do know that, particularly at night, vehicles regularly drive at 60-70mph and, even during the day, will overtake other vehicles keeping to the speed limit.

As a result of the survey, the police have agreed to install interactive signs. However, this will not occur until mid/end August, as there are none available until then, and we shall have to wait to see whether they are permanent or only temporary.
