SEEND AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB

Our coach trip this year was a successful visit to three gardens. The first at Stour Provost in Dorset was a real success. It is about an acre but so densely planted and arranged with flower-beds and groups of pots that 40 of us disappeared into the undergrowth and could be heard but not seen. It is also a nursery and specialises in dahlias, which were magnificent. Quite a lot were sold! We had very welcome coffee and cake and then moved on to Lytes Cary where there was time for a picnic lunch and a visit to the house as well as the garden. Our last visit was to East Lambrook Manor in Somerset where we had tea and wandered round the garden despite the showers. It was crammed full with the cottage garden plants that are now fashionable but were quite unusual when this garden was made. Many thanks to Monica for all the organising, especially when our second garden cancelled and another had to be found.

For the second year running our September speaker cancelled, so a new speaker had to be found at fairly short notice. Luckily Mr Alan Christopher was happy to come and speak to us, his fee going to sponsor the training of a guide dog for the blind, each dog costing an unbelievable amount of money to train and keep.

Mr Christopher started his training as the lowliest member of the team, moved on after his 2 year apprenticeship to achieve further qualifications elsewhere, became a head gardener and eventually ran his own landscaping business, so is very qualified to talk about winding the garden down for the winter. The information he gave us was very useful and too much to repeat, but can be summed up thus. Collect seeds from your plants and sow straight away, keeping the pots in a cold frame if you have one. Plant bulbs now and if planting bulbs for indoors at Christmas make sure you have specially treated ones. Sow sweet peas as they will be stronger than those from later sowings. Sow broad beans and put onions and garlic in. Split large herbaceous plant clumps using 2 back to back forks, re-planting the outside pieces but discarding the centre. Prune rambling and climbing roses but not others. Clean your greenhouse. Pick and store apples and put greasebands round to catch the codling moth. Take cuttings of herbs to grow indoors over winter. Aerate the lawn with a fork and brush lawn sand into the holes. Cover ponds to keep out leaves. Service your mower, clean and check tools and clean garden furniture. Most important check under bonfires for hedgehogs.

If you really manage to do all those jobs you will need the winter to recuperate!
The winner of the vase of herbs competition was Mary Hardstaff.

Our next speaker, on October 13th, is Derry Watkins from Special Plants near Bristol. She is a well-known plantswoman who travels the world collecting hardy herbaceous and tender perennial plants. She will be talking about gravel gardens. Non-members are welcome but there will be a small charge this month. The competition will be a succulent or cacti in a pot.

SEEND PARISH COUNCIL

The meeting held on 28th July was attended by eight Councillors, with Chairman, Mike Davis, in the chair. Community Beat Manager PC Emily Thomas and members of the public were also in attendance. Apologies from Mrs Carr, Mr Manning and County Councillor J Seed.

There were no items from the floor for discussion.

Seend Cricket Club – It was proposed that the PC donate the sum of £1,000 towards the new cricket pitch. A vote was taken by show of hands, which was unanimous.

Area Boards – Mrs Savage reported that she had attended the first Area Board meeting held on 1st July, and had raised the question both of traffic speed through the village and possible calming measures, and funding for the Seend Shuttle. “Issue Reports” on both these subjects had been sent to Wiltshire Council.

Traffic speed – PC Emily Thomas advised that training of members of the public in the use of speed cameras was being rolled out in rural areas, under the Community Safety Partnership. She understood that Seend was to be supplied with a “Smiley SID” device, but advised that there are issues with how these are set up. There are currently 4 available to cover the whole of Wiltshire. It was suggested that if Seend wanted a permanent inter-active sign to deter speeding through the High Street, it would probably have to be purchased.

Spiderweb Paddock –The Planning Enforcement Officer at Wiltshire Council advised by e- mail that on 7 July he had carried out a joint visit with the Police to Spiderweb Paddock. They waited for 45 minutes, but did not see anybody on the site. Further visits will be conducted.

Vandalism at Seend School – It was confirmed that the footpath at the back of the school has been re-opened.

Mobile home, G & S Patios – Cllr Seed forwarded an e-mail from Wiltshire Council, advising that a site visit was made on 30 July and photographs taken of the mobile home in situ. No planning has been applied for the retention of the home. The owners have been informed that they must either remove the mobile from the land or apply for its retention within 28 days.

Parish Council Election – There were four nominations for the forthcoming PC election on 30th July: Mr Philip Cottle, Craysmarsh Farm, Bath Road; Mr Steve Diffey, Somerset Close; Mr Peter Newsom, Berhills Lane, Seend and Mrs Louise Waylen, The Lye.

Letter received from Wiltshire Council concerning a **freight study on the A361** from Littleton Roundabout to Seend Fork. The recommendation of the study is that a weight limit should be introduced on this route. A summary outlining the findings of the study were attached. Following discussion, it was agreed Wiltshire Council should be approached to see if somebody from Transport Development Services could come and talk about this at a PC meeting.

Letter received from Wiltshire Council to advise that **Highways Services for Seend** would now be covered from Lancaster Road, Bowerhill.

The meeting held on 25th August was attended by eight Councillors, with Chairman, Mike Davis, in the chair. Ms Abbi Gutierrez, Melksham Community Area Manager and members of the public were also in attendance. Apologies received from Mr Haines, Mrs Heatley, Mr Padfield and County Councillor J Seed.

The Chairman welcomed **Mrs Louise Waylen** to the Parish Council, following her election on 30th July.

A request had been received for the following items to be discussed:

Can the PC financially support, and request funding from Wiltshire Council, for **permanent inter-active speed signs** at appropriate points either side of the A361 Seend High Street?

Discuss the recommendations of the **freight study** – A361 Littleton roundabout to Seend Fork, as outlined in Wiltshire Council's letter of 16 July.

Consider the views of those present on **other traffic calming measures** that may be appropriate along the High Street to aid the reduction of motorists' speed through the village.

There was a discussion about the recent positioning of two “**Smiley SID**” devices either side of the High Street. These flashed up the speed of on-coming motorists, but did not record any analysis of speed. It was noted that the sign at the west end of the village had not been particularly well positioned, and was not very visible to oncoming traffic, although the sign facing east had been clearly visible. It was generally felt that motorists do react to these signs and slow their speed. It was stated that permanent devices were in the order of £2,000 each, and it was not known if there are on-going running costs.

The Chairman advised that the PC had tried to arrange for a member of the Highways Department to attend a **meeting to discuss the freight study**, but nobody was available for this evening’s meeting. An e-mail from Transport Development Services, Wiltshire Council, advised that, at present, this is an informal consultation, aiming to seek peoples’ views on whether a weight limit would be appropriate on the A361, there is no formal proposal for a weight limit at this time. It was stated from the floor that the freight study, that had taken place in November 2008, had concluded that the A361 was not designed to take heavy freight lorries, but that the A365 was. It was pointed out that there will be two new crossings and a speed limit past the new Melksham Oak School on the A365. Summing up, the Chairman agreed that, in the light of clear public interest in this subject, it was important to arrange a meeting.

Abbi Gutierrez, Melksham Community Area Manager, was in attendance, and explained that her job was to support the Area Board and Councillors and be a link between the community and partners, such as police and health services. The next meeting of the **Melksham Area Board** would be on 23rd September in Bowerhill Parish Hall. She said that the question of traffic has been raised across the whole county, and will be looked at at a strategic level. She explained that there is a grant scheme for village projects, such as traffic calming signs, up to £5,000 for match funding. She said that the Area Board is the forum for raising issues of concern in the local area, and making Councillors aware of local issues.

Seend Cricket Club –Letter received from Brian Hunt, Seend Cricket Club Chairman, thanking the PC for their donation of £1,000 towards the provision of a new cricket pitch.

Spiderweb Paddock –An e-mail had been received from Wiltshire Council, advising that an early morning visit has been paid to Spiderweb Paddock, that they had gained entry and had access to the stable block. The caravan located within the barn is there on a temporary basis and is going to be removed. Based on this visit, the Council are of the opinion that no evidence is available that the owners of the site are sleeping there and, therefore, will be taking no further action. They have written to the owners, reminding them that the conditions that were placed within the enforcement notice remain on the land, and if there is a breach they will re-visit the site. The PC would write again to the Council to ask

when they will check that the caravan has been removed from the barn. Members of the public present expressed disappointment at the outcome of the Council's visit.

Mobile home, G & S Patios – Nothing appears to have happened with regard to the mobile home at the G & S Patios site. This will be followed up with Wiltshire Council.

There were **no new applications** for consideration.

Letter received from Wiltshire Council, advising that it has made an Order diverting the **public right of way (Seend footpath 41)** from its course through the farm yard at Totterdown Farm to a route leading north east to an old lane to rejoin bridleway 41. The order will be advertised in the Wiltshire Gazette on 13th August.

Notice received that the **Parish Steward** will be in Seend on 22nd September. Jobs to be notified to him are – cutting back of briar by the reservoir, School Road. Rusty Lane byway is becoming overgrown and needs cutting back. The tarmac footpath along the A361 from The Bell to The Stocks needs resurfacing. There is a large pothole at Inmarsh on the bend between Broomhayes Farm and Knightsmead Farm.

The litter bins on **the canal** are full, there are potholes on the footpath leading down to the canal at the Barge Inn, and also the repair to the crack in the bridge at the Barge Inn is deteriorating. British Waterways to be advised.

It was noted that there were more skid marks by **the bridge in Station Road**. Accidents at this location are becoming a regular occurrence. Highways will be contacted about a possible speed limit reduction.

The PC would like your help to monitor the effectiveness of the emptying of litter bins around the village. Is there a litter bin in your area of the village? Does it become overfull? Should it be emptied more frequently? Would you be prepared to monitor the situation and advise the Parish Council, so that this issue can be raised with Wiltshire Council? The PC wants to put together a list of all litter bins around the village, so that the situation can be properly monitored. Please advise the Clerk of the location of bins near you, and whether you are prepared to help with monitoring. Contact Rosemary Fisher on 828281 or e-mail owletts@care4free.net

BITS'N'BOBS



Wiltshire Fire & Rescue Service - Chimney Fire Safety

With the colder nights starting, many of us will be lighting our fires and wood burners. These simple guidelines will help to keep you safe:

- keep chimneys and flues clean and well maintained (see below)
- make sure embers are put out properly when you go to bed
- be careful around open fires. Use a fireguard to protect against flying sparks
- fit a smoke alarm on every level of your home and test it weekly
- contact your local fire and rescue service for a home fire risk check.

Chimney sweeping is important. Sweeping the flue/chimney removes the deposits that build up when burning carbon-based fuels. This lessens the chances of a chimney fire. Sweeping frequency recommendations are:

Smokeless coals	At least once a year
Wood	Up to four times a year
Bituminous coal	Twice a year
Oil	Once a year
Gas	Once a year
