Letter from the Vicar

Emmanuel - GOD WITH US ...

I can hardly believe that I've just celebrated the first anniversary of my arrival here in our villages, or that we're approaching the church's season of Advent already. "Advent" is the four weeks immediately prior to Christmas Day and this year we holding the joint service of **Advent Carols and Readings at Bulkington, at 6pm, on 28th November**. Do come, if you can - everyone is warmly welcome. The season is marked by a change of the altar frontal from red to purple. In biblical times purple was the colour worn by kings. It is also the colour for penitence – a time to reflect on those things we have done that we now regret. Advent is also a time of expectation, of waiting for the birth of "the long expected Jesus" - Emmanuel, *God with us*, which we will celebrate at Christmas – expectation and anticipation in the light of Christ's promise that he will come again.

The past year has brought home to me just what a great privilege it is for me to serve in these parishes. I would dearly love to visit every household - to hear and share with you your concerns as well as your joys. Realistically, however, that is totally impractical. Only a handful of people can be found indoors during the daytime. And I am conscious that very few people would welcome a visit from the vicar when they've just returned home from work and are in the middle of their dinner, or enjoying a programme on TV! Despite the realities of the situation, bearing in mind, too, the sheer number of households there are in the benefice, people still think "the church" doesn't care if "the vicar" hasn't bothered to call! In this I need your help. Please do contact me if you know of anyone who would like me to visit – they (you!) don't have to be a member of the church to qualify! I know many people act as unsung heroes, quietly looking after neighbours and friends, noticing whether or not the milk or daily newspaper has been collected, or the curtains pulled – and I thank God for each one of you, his living presence here on earth.



Turning now to this Christmas season: this year we will be celebrating a joint **Christingle Service on Sunday 5th December at 4pm at Seend Church**: this has proved to be a very popular service for all the family in past years and I hope you will come along again, and make it really special. Details of all the other

Christmas services can be found elsewhere in this magazine, and on posters. And speaking of Christmas, as last year, instead of sending individual Christmas cards, I will be making a donation to charity on behalf of each parish and a card will be displayed in the porch of each church nearer the time. This year it will be the Barnabas Fund, which provides aid relief to our Christian brothers and sisters who are usually last in line for help in so many countries where there is conflict or natural disasters.

Finally, may God bless you, your families and friends richly this Advent and Christmastide.

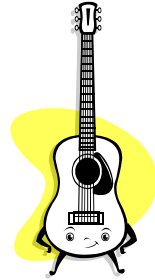

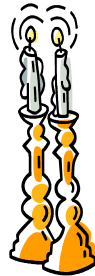

FROM ROY

Advent is a challenging time for me. It asks us to consider what we have not yet got. It puts a new slant on the question: ‘What do you want for Christmas?’ Christmas is the Christian season that is always in danger of swamping Advent. So it is good to spend a while contemplating the new angle that Advent puts on this question because it asks us to look at our expectations. What are we looking for God to fulfil in our human history? What are we still wrestling with?

When we ask these questions, some of the great themes of human endeavour soon emerge. We are still looking for peace. We are still looking for the end of poverty. We are still looking for the overcoming of disease. Advent is the season of the great Old Testament prophecies of hope - the prophecies that lift our eyes to the distant horizon and dare us to dream of God’s possibilities for our world. They re-awaken a longing within us for a different world to the one we inhabit. They are a call to trust in God and a call to prayer that carries us deeper into the heart of God.

And just when all this seems like wistful thinking, God comes to us in a surprising way. God comes in human form. God comes in one like us wrestling with all that it means to be human and vulnerable, to be caught between our great hopes and the sickening reality of life. And Christ challenges the powers of darkness, he releases the energy of compassion and he unleashes a life-giving spirit. And when all that he has to offer is thwarted, he rises again in unquenchable hope. We cradle a baby at Christmas, but in truth we are nursing new life for the world – God’s new life. It’s new life to be cradled in each and every one of our hearts. It gives us all joyful hope.

God bless us all this Advent and on through Christmas,

SEEND PARISH COUNCIL

The meeting held on 26th October was attended by 10 Councillors, with Mrs A Heatley in the Chair. Cllr J Seed and a member of the public were also in attendance. Apologies received from Mr. D. Nichols and PC Emily Thomas.

Footpath and Bridleway no. 6

E-mail received from Esther Daly, to advise that no further progress has been made with the issues relating to Footpath no. 6. Wiltshire Council has been waiting for Mr. MacDonald to get back to them with his diversion application. Mrs. Daly will write to him to find out why no application has been made.

Allotments – potential site for social housing

A suggestion had been received that the allotment site be considered for social housing for single young people. The deeds of the allotment site have been retrieved from safe custody in Lloyds Bank, and these show that the property is held on trust for the use of the inhabitants of Seend for the purpose of recreation and leisure time occupation, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the inhabitants of Seend. Following discussion, it was agreed that quotes would be obtained for widening the entrance to the allotments and installing a slope, and installing water to the site. The Clerk to follow up the enquiry about Community Payback to help clear the site.

Rumble strips, Seend Hill – These have now been removed. E-mail sent to David Thomas, Integrated Transport & Safety Manager, requesting the road be put back to its original condition. It was not possible to move the 30mph sign nearer to Seend Fork.

Smiley SIDs – Cllr. Seed has asked David Bullock to include Seend on the list for a Smiley SID. He has also asked Andy Cadwallader about possible reactive signs for the narrow bend at the western end of Seend High Street.

Notice Boards – It was noted that the right-hand door lock is broken on the notice board outside the Post Office. This will be repaired. **Please note that notices should be restricted to A5 size to enable more notices to be displayed.**

Spout Lane – E-mail received from Parvis Khansari (Service Director for Strategic Services, Highways & Passenger Transport) advising that Spout Lane is not a

priority, and he could not recommend any funding. Cllr Seed advised that he will keep pursuing the matter.

Spiderweb Paddock – The Chairman gave Cllr Seed a Land Registry plan for Bradley Lane, showing ownership of part of the lane. Cllr Seed advised that the recent planning application for pig housing at Spiderweb Paddock was turned down on the height of the buildings ridge, size, scale, impact and sustainability. It was agreed to send a copy of the Bradley Lane plan to the Enforcement Officers and the Chief Planning Officer for information.

Road signs, Martinslade – These works now completed.

Bollands Hill – The order to change the name has gone through without dissent.

War Memorial – No further contact received from the British Legion. The PC will wait for them to come back about possible remedial works to the War Memorial.

Seend Shuttle – A meeting took place on 8th October between the PC, Seend Shuttle and Community First. It was unanimously agreed that Seend PC would take over ownership of the Shuttle from the start of the next financial year.

Seats around village – A quote will be obtained for cleaning and treating the current seats, and repair the window glass in the bus shelter in Sells Green.

Canal bridge, Barge Inn – The Clerk to write to CEO British Waterways about the safety issue.

A361 Bell Inn to The Stocks – The overgrown trees and hedges have been cut back. Works have been carried out to the area of subsidence on the bank.

Bus stop, Bath Road – Works completed.

Traffic speed, Bollands Hill – Cllr Seed agreed to follow up the monitoring of traffic speed on Bollands Hill at the junction with School Rod, and further down the hill where pedestrians cross at the canal.

Dial Close to School Road – Follow up with David Bullock the pedestrian safety issues in this area of the village.

Mrs. Savage had attended the recent Area Board meeting. The Chairman thanked her for attending, and thanked Cllr Seed for pushing through two urgent issues – the proposed road works at Spout Lane, and the question of a technical solution for the old railway bridge in Station Road/Bollands Hill, following a recent fatal accident at the bridge; this will be treated as a priority issue. WILTSHIRE COUNCIL NEWS FROM CLLR JONATHON SEED

The year rolls on and life seems to get busier and busier. The unfortunate resignation of a neighbouring Wiltshire Councillor means that his electorate will need the services of a Councillor until a By Election can be held in the New Year. There can be no period of time when residents are unable to turn to a Councillor and this is particularly important with the statutory aspects of our work in areas like planning. I will be looking after the village of Bromham for the next few months. I know the village well and many Members of the Parish Council are friends so the extra Parish Council to attend will be no difficulty. In addition I have become a substitute Member on the Eastern Area Planning Committee which will also help with Seend and Poulshot planning matters.

Taking the lead in looking after the Melksham Community Area also occupies much of my time. We are blessed with a pretty mature and sensible membership of our Area Board which means that we do not have that much political infighting so we can generally concentrate working together to get the best for our Area. That does not mean that there will not be differing opinions from time to time as my recent spat in the Council Chamber with the Leader of the Liberals and Melksham Councillor Jon Hubbard showed. However we are both as one in our belief that we must work together for the delivery of a Melksham Community Area Campus as soon as possible. It is simply fantastic that in the face of cuts and redundancies and neighbouring Counties closing leisure and library facilities on a daily basis we will still see a £10 million investment in Council and leisure services in Melksham within three years. This is only possible because we can sell the nine old Council sites in our area, making sound economic sense to concentrate Council services onto one site as well as replacing the ageing existing facilities (and their massive projected maintenance budgets) with new state of the art leisure facilities and services. Wiltshire is a forward thinking Council with a positive outlook and with a sound lead from our Area Board we in the Melksham Community Area will be the first to see the immediate and tangible benefits of this approach and sound planning.

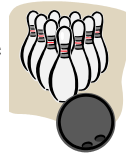
Team update:-
