

Desmond Edwards

Des, or Dessie as he was affectionately known, died peacefully in Savernake Hospital on 11th January, at the age of 81. He was a much loved and respected man both in Seend, where he lived all of his life, and in the towns and villages around. He was unfortunate in that he was born disabled and it is understood was not expected to live, but that determination to overcome his disability must have cut in at that early age and he just had to prove the doctor wrong.

He attended the village school and when he left he was employed as a gardener at Miss Usher's house at the eastern end of the village where he worked many years until the death of Miss Usher. He then worked in Row lane, first for Mr Webster and then for Mr and Mrs Philip Proven. Desmond's gardening knowledge was very comprehensive and many were the number who called upon his expertise.

He lived in the Sells Green area of Seend, moving from the house where he was born about 50 yards along the road to the house in which he lived until his death. He had a great sense of humour; for example, he always told people that he was born in the USA and when pressed on that statement, told them that it was 'Up Stairs in the Attic'. His main social life revolved around the Seend Working Men's Club, which became the Seend Social Club. He was a founder member and acted as Secretary for a great many years. When the new lounge bar was created it was named 'The Desmond Edwards Lounge' in his honour. His other main interest was skittles. He was a member of the Seend 'B' team in the Devizes League, that team being one of the founder teams of the league and similarly with the Rowde Summer League. He was at the time of his death Vice President of both of those leagues.

This obituary cannot close without mentioning Desmond's assistance with the WI Breakfasts where, in his own words, he started by 'making the toast' and was eventually promoted to 'Bacon Chef', all the time keeping the ladies amused in the kitchen with his banter.

His last few years have not been good for him physically, but even then his sense of humour did not fail him. He will be sorely missed.

Peter Fisher adds: Another memory is Des's annual appearance on the Club float at the village Fete, usually in some noble capacity. Latterly he was a Trustee of the Social Club and was supportive of the creation of the Community Centre.

He was very active as a member of the Gardening Club and served on the Flower Show Committee for 55 years. His vast knowledge of shrubs, plants and trees made his advice and contributions particularly valuable and sought after.

He was held in great affection by all that knew him for his personality, his help whenever sought, his willingness to draw on his knowledge of village affairs to explain a situation or to add colour to particular issues. He was a delight to know.

And we must mention his many appearances in the village pantomimes - whether playing the dame, Mr Punch or a parrot - always game for a laugh.

FROM ROY...

‘Unclench your fists.’

I can imagine a clenched fist being banged down on the table and demanding whatever it wants. In the context of prayer, it might mean that we are not open to the possibilities of God because we are too wound up in our own expectations.

Unclench our fists and let the deepest part of our being open up to what God will reveal to us.

This month sees the beginning of our Lenten journey. The journey will take us with Christ to the cross and on to Easter. The cross sees Jesus opening his hands wide to God and to us. Easter is full of promise of new life – God’s opening up to us. There is a way to go still. Maybe as we journey with Christ we will understand something more about ‘unclenching our fists’.

I am going to give up not eating kangaroo meat this Lent. I don’t know whether I shall get the opportunity to eat kangaroo meat, but I will be open to the possibility. Let Lent be for us about being open to possibilities – God’s possibilities.

BOXING DAY REPORT (Great Bulkington Railway) 2009

December 26th dawned with bright sunshine, dry and a good weather forecast which, in the event, (apart from one shower) was mostly true. We were scheduled to start running the trains at 1300hrs and by eleven o'clock in the morning the 'Early Birds' were arriving and asking for a ride! Happily my train crews arrived on time and the first fully loaded train departed bang on 1 o'clock. By 2:30 there were over 70 people in the garden and two passenger trains in operation. My wife Thelma and her friend Angela Read were heavily engaged in cooking and distributing the 200 sausages on sticks that Tim Taylor from the village Well Inn had kindly donated for the event. At the same time we gave away a couple of large tins of 'Quality Street' toffees to our guests and the children. The two trains did 86 trips around the 1000 foot long track– this works out at just over 16 miles and nearly a train departure every 2 minutes! Each train carried an average of 6 or 7 passengers so we carried well over 500 adults and children. I would like to praise the train crews who worked solidly for over three hours without a break – 17 year old Driver Lee Thorp in particular (from West Lavington) and his Guard Ben Dobson (from Bulkington). Both these youngsters have done many hours of training on the railway and are qualified drivers and guards. Thanks to the generosity of our riders and guests we were able to send £581 to our very deserving '*Help For Heroes Fund*'.

SEEND AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB

First of all our apologies for cancelling the January meeting at almost the last minute. It was very icy around the Pavilion and the car park so it was felt safer for everyone to forgo our meeting. The speaker was, I suspect, quite relieved, as were some of the members! I do hope we managed to get the message to everyone in time. At our previous meeting in December, which seems a long time ago now, Milly Carmichael, our speaker talked about the uses and history of holly, ivy and mistletoe and superstitions connected to them. From her extensive list I gleaned the fact that holly is an ivory coloured wood that takes a stain well, and was planted outside houses as a good lightning conductor (not sure about that!) It is apparently very bad luck to cut down a holly tree. Ivy does not harm sound brickwork (but in my garden got under roof tiles into the garage and broke the guttering), is a good dye plant and its late nectar and berries are good for wildlife, especially bees. Also if you put some in your socks for two weeks it will cure verrucas. Mistletoe mainly grows on trees with soft bark, like apple, was a fertility symbol and should be



harvested with a golden sickle. Recent research though has shown it could have useful medicinal properties.

Milly also talked to us about having a 'green' Christmas and her statistics about the huge volume of waste, particularly paper in various forms, were chastening and gave real food for thought.

The winner of the competition for a table centre was Rita Watson.

Next month Chris Smith of Pennard Plants who was unable to come last year will be talking about behind the scenes at the flower shows and the competition will be for the best photo of a single flower.

SEEND PARISH COUNCIL

The meeting held on 24th November was attended by 11 Councillors, with Chairman, Mike Davis, in the chair. Five members of the public were also in attendance, together with County Councillor J. Seed.

An enquiry has been received about **recycling of plastic** in the village, asking if a recycling bin could be sited in Rusty Lane by the present bins. The Area Board has been contacted about this matter, and the advice is that a review of recycling is currently taking place as, prior to the formation of the Unitary Council, the District Councils all had different policies. A county-wide recycling policy will be introduced in 2010. Until that time, it will not be possible to provide separate recycling bins as requested.

Cllr Seed had been in correspondence with Wiltshire Council relating to **Footpath 6**, and advised that the kissing gate will be reinstated back to its original position at Wiltshire Council's expense.

Spiderweb Paddock – The Chairman and Cllr Seed would speak with the owner again for an up-date.

Mobile home, G & S Patios – Letter received from Wiltshire Council, advising that the application for planning permission has been withdrawn on the basis that the proposal does not require planning permission. A breach of planning control has been identified, and the Council will continue to work towards resolution of the matter. The objective is to achieve permanent closure of the former access, the reinstatement of the grass verge and additional planting to screen views of the mobile home. The matter is being passed to the Enforcement Officer.

Speed signs – Cllr Seed advised that plans for providing mobile speed signs for villages are going ahead, and the Area Board will get a decision where they are going in the New Year.

Kennet & Avon Canal **The canal bridge** by the Barge Inn is owned and maintained by British Waterways; they are aware of the condition of the bridge, and it is included in their annual bridge inspection programme.

Spout Lane – **The PC would like to have the views of residents living in Spout Lane on whether they would be in favour of parking restrictions in the lane by means of, for example, double yellow lines? Please feed back your comments to the Parish Clerk, Mrs. Rosemary Fisher.**

WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR NEWS FROM JONATHON SEED

This is the first of regular articles for your Parish Magazine. The aim is to keep you informed of where I am involved on your behalf in the workings of Wiltshire Council and also to expand on particular aspects of the workings of the Council. I will also cover my involvement in local village issues. I am always happy to receive suggestions and feedback so please do contact me at any time.

The New Year has come quickly and brought with it an icy grip on the Country and County. Wiltshire seems to be coping as well as any County in these difficult climatic times. If the lengthy cold snaps are repeated on a regular basis then clearly the County will have to revisit the investment needed to cope with the arctic conditions. For the moment we seem to be coping.

Since being elected last summer I have become deeply involved in the rural affairs of the County and in particular the Division of Summerham and Seend. I attend as many of the seven Parish Council meetings as I can but there are inevitable clashes with other evening meetings. I have been elected as Chairman of the Melksham Area Board and your Parish is making a significant contribution to both the Area Board and the Community Area partnership. Most parishes have also received community grants from the Area Board and Seend received a grant for improvements to the Community Centre.

I have been appointed as Chairman of the Urchfont Manor Adult Learning Centre Board of Management and have recently taken on as Chairman of the northern half of the County's Operational Flood Working Group. This Flood Group works closely with Agencies and local Flood Groups to minimise the effects of flooding in the County. This will also give me an opportunity to help with the particular flooding issues in Keevil, Bulkington and Poulshot as well as in other local areas.

I am a member of the Management and Resources Overview and Scrutiny Select Committee which examines many detailed aspects of the Councils work. I am also a Member of the Licensing Policy Committee and the Western Area Planning Committee. Residents have told me that there is concern at the handling of planning matters by Wiltshire Council. I am always happy to discuss individual applications with residents or Parish Councils. I only have three weeks from the registration of an application to call it in for a Committee decision so I need early involvement to be effective in my help.
