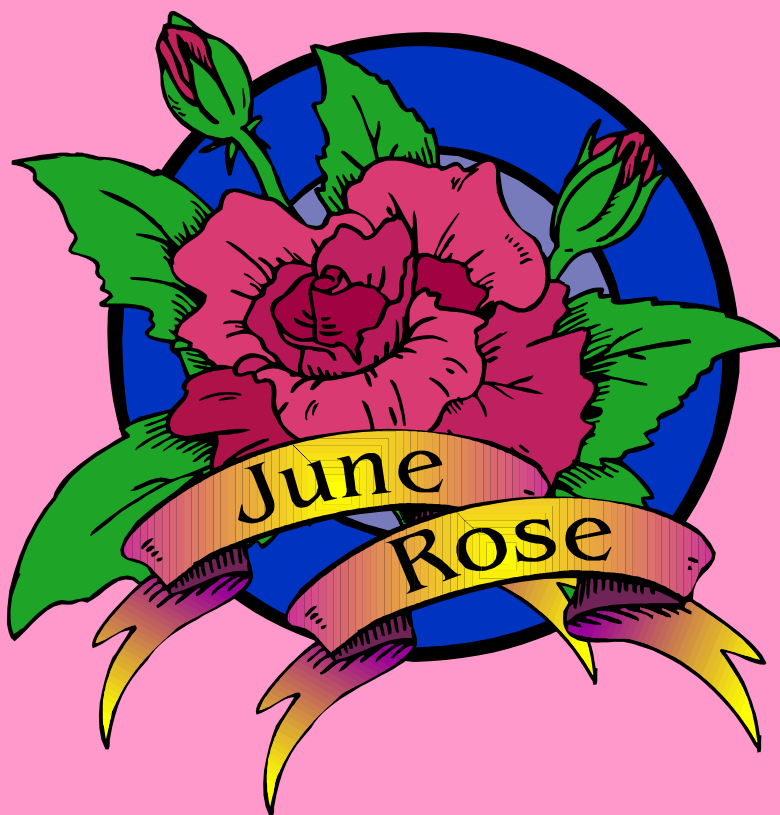

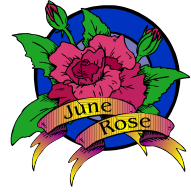

BULKINGTON NEWS

A big thank you must go to the seven villagers and a Cornish visitor along with Paul Millard and Ken Ball from Wiltshire Rights of Way Department who volunteered to help lay many tons of scalplings on Footpath BULK8 adjacent to the pumping station in March. Many wheelbarrow loads were needed, helped by the loan of a powered barrow by our Parish Council chair. The work was needed due to the treacherous condition it was in and the end result is a vast improvement and made the path far safer to walk along. Well done all. A picture of the team can be seen on the village website in the 2010 activities section.

Discussed at Bulkington Parish Council Meeting on 17 March:

Disposing of grass cuttings - green bins too small, but extra ones refused, and there is no suitable site in the village for a dump. Any suggestions welcome. (*See item below*)

Footpath from Pumping Station to be resurfaced and new “kissing gate” put in at the far end.

Cllr Bradford will speak to Highways about filling **potholes** etc on Back Lane. Footpath from Seend Bridge has been closed off – Pc Thomas will contact Wiltshire Council.

Police warning of **thefts**, especially from isolated farms – meat from freezers and 4WD vehicles such as Land Rovers.

Drainage – Area Board Flood Prevention Plan welcomed, but still difficulties in Bulkington; Wickleaze Lane ditch to be cleared by landowner(s). Cllr Ogilvie will keep Spotlight up to date with developments.

More **litter bins** to be provided, especially for dog waste.

Area Board refused joint application led by Melksham Without for mobile **Speed Indicators**, suggested application to Wilts & Swindon Road Safety Partnership.

Playing Field – still waiting for news of grant for new play equipment.

Fears of “**night hawking**” dismissed – holes and heaps of spoil must be work of moles.

Planning: (revised) Application for extension at 28 Bulkington – Permitted.

Draft **Accounts** for 2009/10 – no queries at this stage, last set of payments approved. Final Accounts, after Internal Audit, to be agreed at Council’s Annual Meeting in May.

Decided to raise Section 137 grant to PCC for **churchyard maintenance** to £120.

What Do I do with my grass cuttings?

We all know the problem - the lawn looks fabulous...but where do the grass cuttings go? Please don’t dump them “ over the fence”, because they might cause an obstruction to a ditch, waterway or footpath. Everyone will be aware of the efforts made by the Council and landowners alike to improve drainage and reduce flood risk in the village.....having made this effort we now have a responsibility to maintain things.

There are many ways to dispose of mowing leftovers so that they need never be a problem:

Bin them.

We all have green bins to dispose of grass cuttings. Of course, this is limited in volume, so the average country-garden lawn owner could fill this many times over in one mowing session.

Don’t be tempted to put them in your standard wheelie bin, because sending cuttings to landfill is an expensive and sinful waste of landfill space. Why not explore other options?

Compost them.

Grass cuttings are approximately 85 percent water and 4 percent nitrogen, which means if composted correctly they will rapidly reduce to one tenth of their volume. Your bag of cuttings will reduce to handful or two of compost.

The wet “green” material (grass cuttings, veg peelings etc.) should be roughly balanced out by dry “brown” material (newspaper, cardboard, sawdust etc.), reducing nitrogenous materials and allowing air to circulate. By adding a bag of newspaper for each bag of grass, you will ensure the cuttings cannot overwhelm your heap.

Return them.

The simplest way of getting rid of grass cuttings is to leave them on your lawn, where they will dehydrate before decomposing and disappearing from view, recycling non-toxic nutrients back into the soil. It reduces your mowing time due

to the lack of bag emptying and may save the expense of buying lawn feed. But you must mow frequently (every five days) to prevent your lawn drowning in grass cuttings longer than an inch.

Mulch them.

Grass cuttings can be used for weed control at the base of your hedges, whilst retaining moisture and adding organic matter/nutrients to the soil. For best results spread no more than an inch or two depth of weed free grass cuttings at the base of the hedge avoiding its main stems. Do not add any more clippings until the previous batch has broken down.

What ever you do with your grass cuttings, thank you in advance for not feeding them to animals, or allowing them to obstruct any of our vital waterways.

SEEND PARISH COUNCIL

The meeting held on 27th April was attended by eight Councillors, with Mrs T Carr in the Chair, in the absence of the Chairman and Vice-Chairman. Members of the public were also in attendance, together with County Councillor J. Seed.

Footpath issues

The Footpaths Officer, Esther Daly, confirmed that a meeting had taken place between the County Council, the Footpaths Officer and the owner of the field across which the footpath (SEEN 6) runs. The owner is considering making a proposal to alter the route of the footpath so that it goes along the boundary of the field rather than across it, but the application has not been submitted yet. Cllr Seed confirmed that once an application is made, the PC and parishioners will be able to make comments.

Community Police matters

PC Emily Thomas advised that there had been a break in at church. CSO Rose Baldock will be covering the fête.

Spout Lane – E-mail received from Highways to advise that as ditches are the responsibility of the adjacent landowner, the Parish Steward is unable to dig them out. It was agreed to approach the Caravan & Camping Club to ask if they are in agreement with the ditch being piped and filled in.

Road signage, Martinslade – E-mail received from Mark Stansby, Senior Traffic Management Engineer, suggesting dates for a meeting May 5th, 7th,

11th, 12th and 13th. Mrs. Savage agreed to contact residents of Martinslade and telephone Mr. Stansby to arrange a mutually convenient meeting.

Spiderweb Paddock – Details of Mr & Mrs Shearmon’s applications relating to Spiderweb Paddock had now been passed to all members of the PC.

Website – It was suggested that a link should be placed on the Seend Village website to the Parish Council website.

Bench in Love Walk – it was unclear on whose land this bench stood, it was agreed to ask the owner of Wiltshire House.

G & S Patios – The kerbing and landscaping was now complete.

Red telephone boxes – E-mail received from Pam Sewell at Wiltshire Council, to advise that the cost of adoption of a telephone box was £1. The PC would then be responsible for maintenance of the box, and if the PC wished the box removed in the future, they would be responsible for the cost of removal. E-mail received from the insurance brokers to advise that the cost of insurance would possibly mean an additional premium of £4.50 p.a.

Correspondence

Letter received from Wiltshire Council, advising that they are preparing a plan that will identify **land for travelling communities** in Wiltshire. There is an eight-week public consultation on the issues and approach to identifying land.

E-mail from Melksham Without PC to advise that Bowerhill Residents Action

Group plan to erect some **picnic benches** at the canal end of the footpath and bridleway from the K & A Canal and Locking Close, Bowerhill. They are advising Seend PC as a matter of courtesy as the land is within Seend PC's boundary. Also, they will need a member of Melksham Without staff to go onto the land to empty litter bins, and so will need Seend PC's agreement to this. The PC had no objections to the picnic benches, but felt that the provision of litter bins may cause further littering when the bins were filled.

Letter received from Derek Barnes, Hon. Secretary of Seend Branch of the Royal British Legion, enclosing replies received from relatives of those listed on the **War Memorial**. These replies were all opposed to the possible removal of the War Memorial from its present site in the churchyard.

MESSAGE FROM WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR JONATHON SEED

I have enjoyed the past year as the Melksham Area Board Chairman and by the time you read this I hope to have been re-elected for a further year. Inclusion in the Melksham Area Board was not universally popular throughout the Division and clearly the process could have allowed for more consultation with the people of our seven villages. However we have not done at all badly out of our partnership with the Melksham Area, having had at least our fair share of grant funding as well as a good amount of influence in the affairs of the Board. I have not forgotten that we obtained a commitment from the Council that the parishes would be asked for their opinion of how they felt that things were working after a year in the Melksham Community Area and I will ensure that Wiltshire Council honours that agreement. My own opinion has not changed and I do hope that we will all still be working with Melksham for the foreseeable future – and that the partnership relationship will be all the stronger for a final consultation with the parishes of Summerham and Seend in the next month.

Political and Council work in Summerham and Seend also continues alongside Westminster matters and it is incredibly rewarding to be able to make a difference to community and individual lives by operating as your Wiltshire Councillor. Over the past month I have been quite heavily involved in planning issues in Seend, Steeple Ashton and Semington as well as improving my knowledge on Gypsy and Traveller Planning Matters. Planning issues are always of great concern to those immediately affected by them largely because they involve change or potential change to people's immediate environment. Most planning applications are determined by officers under delegated powers but some applications do come before a Committee of Council Members. In between all of this there is scope for discussion and negotiation with officers and often I am asked to help this process

along. Our Planning Officers are human and do like to be as helpful and professional as they can but they need to assess all the information concerning an application in order to reach the right decision. It is thus always helpful to talk to planners at the earliest possible stage in an application. Finally the local Member can only call an application to Committee within three weeks of registration so do involve me at an early stage if you need help.
