



Maureen's Ramblings.....

I am writing this at the end of the weekend of celebrations for the Queen's Diamond Jubilee and I have had a wonderful time! I enjoyed all the community events I attended; I loved the River Pageant, (especially as I saw it in the warmth of my own home!); I enjoyed the Concert in the Mall (mmm... Grace Jones is two years older than me – maybe I should take up the hula hoop!?) And I loved the Service of Thanksgiving in St. Paul's Cathedral. The Christian faith is so obviously important to the Queen and she finds courage, strength, comfort and hope in Jesus. In one of her Christmas broadcasts she said, "For me the teachings of Christ and my own personal accountability before God provide a framework in which I try to lead my life. I, like so many of you, have drawn great comfort in difficult times from Christ's words and example." And she has known difficult times. Despite all the wealth and the privileges, the Queen has suffered as we all suffer. She lost her father when in her twenties. She has buried

her mother and her younger sister. She experienced the tragic murder of her friend and confidante, Lord Mountbatten and suffered with her children as they experienced painful and broken relationships. She too has seen loved ones go off to war, some who never returned – her pain, sadness and anxiety all lived out in public view. She has said, "I know just how much I rely on my own faith to guide me through the good times and the bad. Each day is a new beginning, I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right, to take the long view, to give of my best in all that the day brings, to put my trust in God and to find in him a source of strength and courage." Yes! Celebration and thanksgiving are good for me!

And what a summer we still have to look forward to – full of hope and optimism, and hopefully more celebration and thanksgiving! Although I am not an avid football fan I hope that England will win Euro 2012 and that Andy Murray will win Wimbledon. I also hope that the Olympics will be wonderful in every way – a great celebration of youth and sporting achievement and of the ability that we have in this country to put on a spectacular event. Celebration and thanksgiving, hope and optimism are so important for all of us. This would likely imply some basic skills in web design and knowledge of available software systems, and certainly an interest in presenting a more exciting delivery to our readers/viewers.

Our current village website was built in 2009 using the free services and hosting facility provided by West Wiltshire Community Web, funded by the then County and District Councils. The site was developed and is maintained by a local company, Cravenplan Computers Ltd, and today remains a free service to villages and communities in Wiltshire. Since 2009 I have continued to populate the website with what I deem to be useful information and to add many references and photographs of our village surroundings and activities so that we as villagers and those who are interested in Bulkington can gain an insight to our lives, village facilities and local services. It has proved popular with some who choose to research the village prior to relocating home from elsewhere.

Maintenance and updating of the website is not onerous or particularly time-consuming since village life does not move at lightning speed, and mostly consists of recording the latest summer event, updating Parish Council records, or uploading someone's event poster to the web. However the website is 'clunky' and poorly presented, largely due to the limitations in the build software and its formula driven approach to page layout and design. It does not look 'sexy', has little or no colour or style, and is graphically challenged to say the least. So the best thing is its content then!

The meeting held on **Tuesday 29th May** was attended by seven Councillors with Mr. J. Padfield in the chair. Apologies received from Mr Diffey, Mr Johnson, Mr Manning and Cllr J Seed.

Police Matters

CPSO Baldock was present and advised that there had been three break-ins recently in the village, including at the top of Inmarsh Lane, where chain saws had been taken and at Manor Field where tools had been taken. It was thought that the same people were responsible but, unfortunately, nobody had seen anything.

Allotments – Work on allotment entrance will commence on Saturday 9th June. There is still an area to be cleared (where the chicken were) and an old wooden building checked to see if it is safe and possibly remove. No response from Community Payback about help with clearing the rest of the allotment site.

Rusty Lane – Complete finger post now received from Barkston Plastics, and ready to be installed.

Footpath SEEN4, Three Magpies – E-mail from Stephen Matthews, Cleansing Technician; still awaiting delivery of bin, delays caused by end of financial year. He will advise when it is installed, and will not charge for installation because of delay.

Seend Shuttle – Mr Murch had circulated the Draft Constitution to Councillors for consideration, and it will then come back to the June meeting for ratification. The PC may want to delegate powers to the sub-committee to agree to repairs/new tyres etc for the vehicle, to be authorised by the Chairman, rather than wait for a full PC meeting. The Shuttle finances will be reported each year at the Annual Parish Meeting. He is still awaiting a quote for the new bus.

Smiley SID – The Metro count results indicated that the average speed of 85% of vehicles was just over 30mph, this meant no action to be taken. Email sent to David Phillips at Sustainable Transport, Wilts Council, to ask about the traffic count at Bell crossroads, awaiting response. Mr Murch suggested two further sites for a Metro count, bottom of Perrys Lane and in the High Street.

Grange Farm, West Ashton - Letter received from the Clerk at West Ashton PC, advising that they had distributed nearly 300 questionnaires, 75 original copies were returned plus 12 copied forms. 85% of the respondents were opposed to the proposed wind farm. In view of this, the PC had decided to formally oppose any future application for wind turbines on the Grange Farm site. Mr Murch said that Seend PC needs to come to a view on alternative forms of energy. Mrs Carr said that it would depend on individual applications.

In view of the fact that planning applications are likely to be received in the future, the Parish Council would be interested in the views of all parishioners on the installation of alternative forms of energy, i.e. solar panels, wind turbines etc. Are you in favour of these applications in principle, or against? How sustainable do you think they are? You can send your views by email via the website www.seendparishcouncil.co.uk or by mail to the Clerk at 12 The Stocks, Seend Cleeve SN12 6PH

Bridge at Barge Inn – E-mail from Richard Leigh, Principal Waterway Engineer, to advise that he had met with the Regional Engineering Team on 17 April and discussed the bridge. They reported that the bridge has been monitored regularly over the past six months and minimal movement has been noted. Consequently, they are currently planning to complete Major Works to the bridge during 2015/16, though this will depend on available resources and the rate of the bridge's deterioration.

Solar farm, Craysmarsh Farm – Letter received from Lightsource Renewable Energy Ltd, the applicants for the solar farm, responding to comments made by the PC to the application. Mrs Carr said there is no mention of an environmental assessment. The Chairman asked Councillors to vote on whether or not to formally object to the application. Proposal: Seend PC objects to the installation of solar panels at Craysmarsh Farm. The vote was Yes 4, No 2, 1 abstention.

Parish/Neighbourhood Plan

Mr Murch advised that there were insufficient numbers of Councillors (4 needed) to attend the Community First event on 23rd June, however, he was still hoping to attend the workshop with Mrs A'Bear. If it was felt that a Neighbourhood Plan would prove too expensive to produce, the PC could opt for a Parish Plan instead, using the Village Appraisal as a starting point.

Jubilee Celebrations

Mrs Ewing has the Jubilee mugs for the schoolchildren, but there has not been any contact from the school to date about the presentation. Mrs A'Bear has mugs for the playgroup and any extras, i.e. children not attending the village school. Comments had been received that tickets for the evening event were expensive for families with children. Mrs A'Bear will speak to Hattie about what the policy is on children attending, and whether a reduction could be made for families.

Planning Matters

E/12/0568/LBC The Old Bakehouse, High Street

Erection of porch

There were no objections to this application, all in favour.

Correspondence - E-mail received from Nick Haines, drawing the PC's attention to the footpath along the A361 becoming overgrown with nettles. The Clerk to find out if this is due to be cut back shortly, if not get a quote for this to be done.

Railway bridge – Mr Murch welcomed the news that the old railway bridge in Station Road was going to be filled in and removed.

Footpath between Rusty Lane and Dial Close – This was becoming overgrown with nettles. The Clerk to request the Parish Steward to attend to this when he is next in the village.

Hedge around field at New Buildings – it was noted that a large portion of hedgerow had been removed from around to the field next to 12 New Buildings. The Clerk to check whether this was on the public register with Wiltshire Council.

Inmarsh Lane – It was noted there is a lot of debris on the pavement below the hedge of a house at the top of Inmarsh Lane. The Clerk to request the Parish Steward to deal with this on his next visit to the village.

Wiltshire Council News from Jonathon Seed

June was a month of great activity on renewable energy and planning matters. In principle I am in favour of green energy but not at the expense of our rural way of life and not with the subsidies that schemes currently attract. I have spent a great deal of time addressing the concerns of residents on the Craysmarsh Farm Solar Panel site. I was contacted by several residents with specific concerns on the planning application. We were able to achieve significant amendments including a 25% reduction in the height of the solar panels as well as addressing every single specific concern raised by residents. I have also been very involved in the Campaign to Stop Grange Farm Wind Farm. I have written an amendment to the Wiltshire Core Strategy on the subject. I will take this motion through Council and try to impose reasonable minimum distances for wind turbines from residential dwellings.

June was also the month in which we celebrated the Diamond Jubilee of Her Majesty the Queen. Sixty years on the throne is a monumental achievement but to do it in the dedicated and exemplary fashion (and with a special smile) that our Queen has conducted herself is so very special and we must hope for many more years of her reign as we look to the future. I certainly enjoyed the very special Jubilee Beacon Party in Seend and the excellent pig roast produced by the new Chairman of the Parish Council.

Green Energy Debate

Further to the request from Seend Parish Council for your views on green energy planning applications, Cllr Seed's comments above, and requests for people to submit objections to the Council about the Grange Farm wind farm plans (www.stopgrangefarmwindfarm.com) the editorial team would be particularly interested to hear from people who support projects such as those Cllr Seed mentions – in the interests of editorial balance.
