# **SOME PARISH COUNCIL UPDATES**

17/08217/FUL - **Blossom Hill:** The Parish Council would like to thank all those residents who submitted a comment on the planning application. There were 156 comments uploaded as well as the Parish Council's submission. Councillor Seed has said that the weight of opposition is important. The update is that Councillor Seed has called in the planning application. This means that the decision is no longer down to one planning officer, but will be decided by a full planning committee. The application will be discussed at the Strategic Planning Committee meeting on 6<sup>th</sup> December. Please check the parish council website for an update on this. **Tree Pruning and Tree Removal:** Can we remind those parishioners who live in the Conservation area of Seend that they do need to check the requirements for the pruning or tree removal on their property. Planning permission may have to be sought. Do contact the planning department of Wiltshire Council if you are uncertain. **Planning Matters:** The Parish Council are no longer sent hard copies of any planning applications relating to properties and businesses in Seend. They are just notified by email. And it is up to Councillors to look on-line at the full plans. All planning applications are listed on our website and discussed at the next Parish Council meeting. Sometimes, depending on the date of registration and the date for

when comments have to be submitted, there may be very little time for the Parish Council to make a decision. If you have any concerns about a planning application or wish to speak for or against one, please contact the Clerk.

**CORRESPONDENCE:** Nigel Knott contacted the editors asking for the opportunity to correct what he felt was a factual inaccuracy in Carola Thorpe's response:

"I was NOT co-opted to Seend Parish Council as she states. I became an unelected Member of Seend Parish Council, together with 10 others, because the Candidates nominated for election failed to exceed 11 in number. Therefore no election took place on 4<sup>th</sup> May 2017 to fill the 11 vacant member seats on Seend Parish Council. The differing status of PC Members is identified at Para 1.2 of Seend Parish Council Code of Conduct. The Good Councillor's Guide states on P9 para 1 "It is better for democracy if councillors are elected rather than relying on co-option, so they can be confident that the council is the community's choice of representatives." I enjoyed no vote of confidence and for this reason alone I resigned. Period. Carola seems to suggest that I have been disrespectful of parishioners lack of choice in the matter and democracy is alive and well in Seend as a result. I beg to differ."

Seend Parish Council is looking to appoint a Parish Clerk & RFO with the drive, determination and organisational skills to manage a varied workload. In addition to managing the work of the Parish Council, the post holder will work closely with Councillors to implement the aims and objectives of the Council.

Seend has a population of 1,132 (2011 census). The Parish Council consists of 11 Councillors, and its current Precept is £13,256, and it owns and rents allotments in the village. We gain one, we lose two: after two years on the Steering Group Sue McCulloch decided it was time to resign, whilst Carole Vince became a member by signing the Constitution. Many thanks to Sue for her endeavours on behalf of the Neighbourhood Plan. As Sue was Vice Chair, we have a vacancy for that role.

Unfortunately Tony Trodd has decided he cannot manage the role of Secretary and Minute-taker any more, so we have a further vacancy. He deserves thanks for bringing clarity to our minutes, which is a difficult task if you are also trying to be part of the discussions. Ideally we would like someone to volunteer who would be happy to just focus on Minute-taking. Please do come forward if you think you could take on either of those roles, or even just be a member of the Steering Group. Georgina A'Bear (Chair) would be delighted to hear from you for an exploratory chat (828288). We do need more members.

Georgina A'Bear and Carola Thorpe are continuing to investigate the merits of suitable consultants, and will soon be able to present the Group with our shortlist for discussion.

Vicky Burvill (our WC Link Officer) attended the October meeting and praised the Steering Group's work thus far. She had useful things to say about how we should reduce the proposed number of Visions and Objectives (in the Draft Plan) and make them more appropriate to our specific location and needs. She also spoke about the need to be clear as to the pros and cons of each proposed development site, and to show how the latter might be mitigated where possible. These points tally with some of those from the Consultants we have approached. Liz Simes has been helping us by evaluating each site in a professional manner and has nearly finished this work.

The meetings are open to all parishioners and we welcome your involvement. #### **The View from my Window**

Did you know that the culmination of the whole Christian year is on 26<sup>th</sup> November. "That's a date I don't recognize" you may be thinking, but actually it's the day we celebrate Christ the King. He has been through everything, born, grew up, ministered to so many, died was buried, rose again, appeared to so many, and eventually after all that we finally celebrate him as the heavenly King. Alleluia, and then on Advent Sunday, 3<sup>rd</sup> December it all starts again; the beginning of the Christian year.

One of the wonderful things about the Christian year is that there are so many festivals to mark and to celebrate. It's not just about Christmas, or indeed Easter; there are all those other festivals. Advent Sunday is one of the very special ones and is marked particularly in cathedrals up and down the land. If you have never been, put it on your to do list, to go to one of the Advent carols services in Salisbury Cathedral. It is absolutely spectacular. It starts with the cathedral in total darkness and silence and then just one candle is lit and everyone is aware; and gradually the cathedral is bathed in candlelight with fabulous music throughout it all, until the whole cathedral is full of light and sound and glory.

That's what Advent is about, watching and waiting with growing anticipation until one day, 25<sup>th</sup> December, Christmas comes. The children know about the anticipation, and whilst they make enormous lists of toys that they want, they have within them the understanding of the mystery and wonder and of course love that goes with it all. They share the joy and excitement of their school activities; of their nativity plays, carol and Christingle services, and anyone who has been to a Christingle service will know what I mean. The light reflected in the children's eyes is never to be forgotten. These services are for everyone. I do hope you manage to attend at least one.

There may be some of you who find the Christmas season difficult; maybe you feel lonely, or maybe this will be the first Christmas without a loved one, and so what I say is this. Jesus was born as a little baby, and that is a cause of great joy for everyone, but his promise is to be with us in our hour of need; to walk alongside us when things get tough; to be there with us when all the rest of the world seems so far away. If you can, come along to church and feel the love that is there for you, and hear the Christmas message that the shepherds experienced, the angels sang about and the wise men travelled so far to find, and that message is that the one Almighty God sent his little baby son to be with us to show us the way and to show us that we are all included and to show us that we are all loved. I hope you all have a very happy Christmas.

Our new Rector, the Revd. Alison Bridewell will be leading the Christingle service on 7<sup>th</sup> December in Seend at 6pm, and she will also be taking the benefice Eucharist on 31<sup>st</sup> December. For details of all services see next page, or on the Christmas card.







# **SEEND PARISH COUNCIL**

NB. The following minutes are a shortened version of the full minutes taken at the Parish Council meeting of 31<sup>st</sup> October 2017. These have not yet been ratified by the Parish Council and may be subject to change. A full copy of the minutes can be found on our website: www.seendparishcouncil.co.uk

**The meeting held on 31<sup>st</sup> October** was attended by 11 Councillors with Mr Murch in the chair, Councillor Jonathon Seed, Mrs S Bond (Clerk) and 13 parishioners.

**POLICE MATTERS:** Apologies were received from PCSO Maggie Ledbury who was unable to attend the meeting, but she notified us of the following incidents:

On Saturday morning 7th October a White crew-cab Ford tipper SK 65 VHP bearing the name "P & M Driveways" was driven into the private storage yard of Windsmere Stone & Granite at Sells Green, in spite of No Unauthorised Entry signs. Mr Johnson challenged the driver, a white male around 40 years with a thick Irish accent, stocky with short dark hair and facial stubble, accompanied by a boy aged about 10. Mr Johnson said that it was obvious that he was not a customer and was scanning the contents of the yard. When asked to leave he became belligerent, aggressive and foul mouthed. His excuse for not heeding the warning notices was that he couldn't read.

A catalytic converter was stolen from a Honda CRV motor car overnight whilst it was parked in Bath Road, Sells Green.

Other incidents to report include:

17<sup>th</sup> Oct Exhaust stolen from a vehicle in Rusty Lane

19<sup>th</sup> Oct Shed burglary in Perry's Lane. Hedge trimmers stolen.

28<sup>th</sup> Oct Fail to Stop RTC on Bollands Hill.

Police will only record a traffic accident if there is a personal injury. However, if a car hits another vehicle and then drives off, it becomes a crime.

#### PLANNING MATTERS

Application Number: 17/08217/FUL – Blossom Hill, Trowbridge Road, Seend Update: Councillor Seed had a meeting with the Planning Officer Mr Jones on the 16<sup>th</sup> October. Should the Planning Officer be minded to approve the planning application, then Councillor Seed will call in the application so that it can be considered by the Strategic Planning Committee. (See Announcements section for further news. Eds.) The Chairman highlighted an inaccuracy in the Landscape Officer's report which said there were two SSSIs in close proximity. There are in fact three, one of which adjoins the applicant's site. The Chairman asked Councillor Seed to convey this to the Planning Officer.

Spiderweb Paddock: It is now 10 years since the Appeal Decision which set out a number of conditions on the landowner, some of which are still being flouted. The Chairman expressed frustration that the Enforcement Officer cannot do more to enforce the conditions. A resident reported that vehicles leave the site every morning, a strong indicator that someone is living on the site. Also, a generator can be heard at night and early in the morning. The resident expressed frustration that evidence provided some years ago seemed to have been ignored. Councillor Seed said that the evidence had been useful in that it enabled the Enforcement Officer to serve a notice that stated they can never claim residency. This can never be revoked. Councillor Seed advised Councillors that they should gather up evidence that the site was being lived on, such as the working generator and vehicles leaving the site each morning and that non-agricultural vehicles are on site. Mrs McManus asked Councillor Seed what quality of evidence the Enforcement Officer was looking for to prove occupancy. Councillor Seed suggested that it might be useful for the Parish Council to meet with the Enforcement Officer, and he would look into arranging this.

#### 3.1 Application Number: 17/09226/FUL

Site Location: 52 Seend Cleeve, Seend Melksham Wiltshire SN12 6PY Proposal: Conversion of an existing barn within the garden of the property to create studio.

Mrs Heatley proposed that a condition be placed on the planning application that the barn should remain ancillary to the main house. With this condition, it was proposed that the application be approved. This was seconded by Mr Wood. Mr James and Mr Murch had declared an interest, so did not take part in the vote. All other Councillors voted to approve the planning application. Approved unanimously by 9 Councillors.

# **Application Number: 17/09298/FUL**

Site Location: The Barge Inn Seend Cleeve Seend SN12 6QB

Proposal: Covered dining area and associated works, with replacement LPG tank compound and associated car park works. Approval was proposed by Mr Haines and seconded by Mrs A'Bear. Unanimously approved by all Councillors.

# **Application Number: 17/09733/TCA**

Site Location: Elm Cottage Seend Hill Seend Melksham Wiltshire SN12 6RU

Proposal: Beech Trees - reduce to 6 feet.

Approval proposed by Mrs A'Bear and seconded by Mrs Heatley. Unanimously approved by all Councillors.

#### **Application Number: 17/10191/TCA**

Site Location: Manor Field, High Street, Seend

Proposal: Horse Chestnut - Remove 2 lower branches. Ash tree - Remove 1 lower branch. Approval proposed by Mr James, seconded by Mrs Vince. Unanimously approved.

#### **Application Ref: 17/10189/TCA**

Site Location: Wisteria Cottage, High Street, Seend, Melksham SN12 6NU Proposal:- Yew, Cypress & Holly trees - cut back overhang into neighbouring garden. Approval proposed by Mrs McManus, seconded by Mr Williams. Unanimously approved by all Councillors.

#### **Application Ref: 17/09986/FUL**

Site Location: 15 Dial Close, Seend SN12 6NP

Proposal:- Proposed New Access following demolition of existing detached garage, New dwelling and new detached garage.

Full details of the discussion that was had on this planning application can be found in full version of the draft minutes on the website. Mr Wood proposed that the Parish Council object to the planning application. This was seconded by Mrs McManus. At a vote, eight councillors voted in favour of objecting, one voted against the resolution, one abstained and one did not vote. The motion was carried. Seend Parish Council objects to the planning application.

<u>Chairman's Comments</u> - Following the surprise resignation of the Clerk, he called on the Councillors to consider increasing the number of hours the Clerk is paid to work, This should be discussed and agreed at the Precept meeting and any recommendations put to a full Council meeting at the end of November.

<u>Trees to commemorate soldiers who had died in WW1</u>. The Chairman had spoken with the Seend branch of the Royal British Legion and they are invited to attend the November meeting to discuss a possible location for the trees. 25 trees have been ordered – i.e. the number of soldiers that had died from the Parish during WW1.

The Chairman reported that he and the Clerk had received an email from a couple who were considering buying **The Bell pub** to convert it into a family home and a B&B. Councillors felt that this should be supported and a change of use should be accepted. A B&B could be a good use for it. Mr Wood proposed that the Parish Council support this suggestion. Seconded by Mrs Vince. Unanimously approved. The Clerk to write to the couple inviting them to talk with the Parish Council.

# Neighbourhood Plan and Community Land Trust

Mrs A'Bear reported that following the resignation of Mrs McCulloch, there were now just 8 members of the Group. They were now getting quotes from consultants to prepare the Neighbourhood Plan document.

The Chairman reported that following a CLT steering group meeting that he and Mrs A'Bear had attended, he felt very strongly that the Parish Council should support the setting up of a CLT for Seend. He said it was a chance for the parish of Seend to shape its own future by deciding what type and location of housing the village wants.

The Parish Council would be expected to give £500 to help set up the CLT and he urged the Councillors to support the expenditure. Mrs McManus expressed some concerns about the financial implications for the Parish Council and the community commitment that would be needed to ensure its longevity. She did not understand how the money to purchase land etc would be raised. Dr Knott said that money would not be an issue as there were plenty of loans available and the government was supporting the CLT movement. The CLT would work closely with the NPSG, as it would look to them to be a guide in defining the type and numbers of houses needed.

Mrs Vince proposed that Seend Parish Council agrees in principle to support the establishment of a Seend CLT. Seconded by Mr Wood. At a vote ten councillors voted in favour and one against. The motion was carried.

#### **HIGHWAYS & CATG MEETING**

Bell Hill Crossroads: Following the number of accidents that have occurred, the Parish Council had raised a Community Issue calling for a safety review of the crossroads. This was discussed at the CATG meeting on 16<sup>th</sup> October. Mrs McManus and Councillor Seed had successfully persuaded the members of the CATG that a highway review was urgently required. The members voted in favour of putting it into the top five priority issues. This was good news for the Parish. Councillor Seed reported that the highway safety concerns of Bell Hill would now be looked at by professional road safety advisers. The study would be funded by Wiltshire Council. Any recommendations that are made following the study would have to be funded through CATG, and Seend Parish Council would have to pay a third of the costs.

<u>Church Crossing</u>: This was given the final go ahead. The Parish Council had already agreed to pay a third of the costs which would be in the region of £2,000. Mr Wood proposed that the Parish Council approve the expenditure of up to £2,000. Seconded by Mrs A'Bear. Unanimously agreed by all Councillors.

Metro Counts at New Buildings and Sells Green: Both applications for metro counts were "in progress" and would hopefully take place soon.

<u>Future Highways improvements for Seend Parish:</u> Councillors felt that it would be useful to set up a sub-group to look at prioritising what highway safety measures it would want to introduce. Mrs McManus, Mr Haines, Mr James and Mr Williams agreed to be on a sub-committee. They would look in detail at the SRSI report and take forward some of the recommendations as well as some additional measures.

**<u>DEFIBRILLATOR:</u>** Mr Wood had circulated detailed costings for the purchase of two defibrillators. The Clerk reported that the Parish Council had now received the Community Benefit cheque from the Sandridge Solar Farm Ltd. This was £1026.49. This would be spent on the purchase of one defibrillator and cabinet. It was felt that there would not be enough funds in this financial year to purchase two defibrillators,

and to defer the purchase of the second until 2018 when we would hope to be able to apply for another BHF grant. Mr James proposed that we first purchase a defibrillator for Seend Cleeve. Seconded by Mr Haines. All Councillors unanimously agreed.

**FINANCIAL MATTERS:** There were 11 cheques for signature **Bank reconciliation** to end of September 2017 - £21,147.03. This included the second payment of the Precept.

There is no council meeting in December. The dates of the next two meetings are: Tuesdays 30th January and 27<sup>th</sup> February at 7.30pm at Seend Community Centre.
