#### **OBITUARY**

We are shocked and saddened to report that **Dr Simon Phillips** of Seend died suddenly at home on February 14th.

Simon was educated at Sherborne School, Dorset where he won a classics scholar-ship to read medicine at Barts Hospital London. He was a contemporary of Mark Rendall, who many will remember as a family GP in Seend. He qualified in 1966 and specialised in neonatal paediatrics in Reading. However, he decided to go into General Practice in Devizes in 1970, eventually becoming the senior partner. Simon was a traditional family doctor, as his father and father-in-law had been, conscientious and always ready to help people in the community. He met Jenny at Barts, they married in 1967 and went on to have two sons and four grandchildren. They lived in Etchilhampton for 36 years where they were involved in many village activities, one of which, pig roasting, took them to the Channel Islands, Plymouth and the Lord Mayor's show in London.

Simon had an intellectual curiosity covering many fields, huge involvement in the integration of Vietnamese Refugees, work on Battle Stress and PTSD for the Military, and civilian advisor to the MOD during the first Gulf War. Jenny and Simon moved, very happily, to Seend in September 2006, where although retired he continued to help parishioners, mainly in Dial Close, with any medical episodes or advice. He sang with Calne Choral Society, was a fisherman, a sailor and keen cyclist. In 2018 he and Jenny with 2 friends did a "Ride and Stride" for the church, in The Vendee, France, visiting 41 churches and raising over £1000. He enjoyed many holidays in far flung places, from Syria to Antarctica and the Arctic, loved Greece and medieval and ancient history. He will be sorely missed by his family and friends and we send our condolences to Jenny, Jeremy and Charles.

# SEEND CLEEVE METHODIST CHAPEL GRAVEYARD GRASS CUTTING

Seend Cleeve residents may have noticed that the graveyard grass is regularly cut from Spring to Autumn. This is currently being done by two local residents on a purely voluntary basis who simply took it upon themselves to keep it looking nice, and to show it is a valued green space in the Cleeve. There are also living relatives who maintain some of the gravestones and do a bit of gardening.

Whilst the Chapel is now a privately owned residence, the Chapel graveyard is still owned by the Methodist Church. Unfortunately, they do not have the funds to pay contractors for its maintenance. Hence, two local chaps took on the task voluntarily. **HELP NEEDED** – These two chaps could now really do with sharing the load of the grass cutting which they try to do on a weekly/fortnightly basis at peak grass cutting times. It would be brilliant if there were 2 or 3 more volunteers to take a turn in grass cutting. You would need to bring your own lawnmower to do the job.

#### **CHURCH NEWS**

#### Maureen's Ramblings.....

Every year the church walks the walk with Jesus from Good Friday to Easter Day – remembering the love story and seeking fresh inspiration for our faith. On Easter Eve we light a fire in the darkness to celebrate the first light of Easter and that Jesus is the "light of Christ" coming into the world. From the fire we light our own candles and bring them into the darkened church which gradually became awash with light. Beautiful symbolism!

Some years ago, as I looked at the candle light, I had a sudden realisation — what does "Resurrection" really mean? Do I really understand what I am celebrating here? My faith tells me it means that Jesus is with us always and that death is not the end of the story - but here I was being given an invitation to explore afresh this central mystery of our faith.

Since then I have never taken the Resurrection for granted. Each Easter I look at the candles casting their light into the darkness and feel that I am caught-up in an eternal love story which is beyond all telling. Do I understand the Resurrection any better now? Of course I don't! The depth of love involved in what Jesus did for us is something I will never be able to understand. Jesus' parables of the man searching for the pearl of great price and the woman searching for her lost coin challenge me continue to search for the meaning of Christ's Resurrection, especially in the midst of all the confusion, doubt, conflict and brokenness that is within me and the world.

The disciples didn't understand the Resurrection either! On Easter morning they had only an empty tomb, a missing body and rumours of Jesus being seen alive again. Mary Magdalene thought the man she met was a gardener - discovering, when he spoke her name - "Mary", that it was Jesus himself. I would love to have been with those disciples - listening to their conversations as they moved from despair to the bare beginnings of hope, then to their own encounters with Jesus, and finally to the realisation that he had indeed 'risen from the dead' and was truly with them now and always.

Do I understand what Resurrection means? No - but I don't have to understand what it means, and I don't have to explain it or convince anyone that it happened. It is enough for me to believe that God came among us simply because he loves us. He spent his life healing, forgiving, and showing, by everything he did and said, that we are loved with a love which is infinite and eternal. It is enough to believe that the Resurrection shows that love does triumph over evil; that light does expel darkness and that there is a joy and hope which is deeper than pain, betrayal, trauma or death and which is ocean deep and always ready to rise again.

#### **Local Council Matters**

Cllr Reay provided the following update:

#### Wiltshire Council's 2024/25 Budget

An additional £36m has been added into the council's service budgets. Overall, the budget for  $2024/25 \sim £490m$  with the council not relying on reserves to invest and provide services. It was confirmed the Wiltshire Council element of council tax will increase by 2.99% increase, plus a 2% levy to be spent adult social care. This will mean an increase of £1.65 per week for a Band D property.

## **Highways Matters Event 26<sup>th</sup> February**

The event was well attended, and a key focus of the meeting was the reengineering of the Black Dog junction near Worton.

#### **Don't** Mess with Wiltshire

'Don't Mess with Wiltshire' is Wiltshire Council's campaign to encourage people to not drop litter. The Council spends more than £2m/year picking up litter. If people picked up their litter this money could be allocated to other services.

#### **Food Waste Collection**

Wiltshire has agreed with DEFRA to work on a programme to collect domestic food waste. This new service could begin in 2027.

#### **Local Grants**

Two organisations in Seend received a grant from Devizes Area Board.

The grant to Nosh & Natter will help keep their meal costs as low as possible. The Lye Field also received a grant towards the purchase of a new mower.

#### **Spout Lane Parking**

A document produced by impacted residents has been sent to Wiltshire Council along with a request for the instigation of a residential parking scheme. Clerk to circulate a copy of the document to Councillors, and update the lead resident directly involved. Clerk to request Spout Lane Parking be added to LHFIG agenda.

#### Parking Canal Bridge

Clerk to request the Canal Bridge Parking be added to LHFIG agenda Cllr Reay to raise issues caused by the increase in semi-permanent moored vessels on the Kennet & Avon Canal with the Parish and the additional issues this has caused with local MPs, MPs Danny Kruger and Michelle Donelan with an expectation of a more senior engagement with the Canal & River Trust.

#### **NEWS FROM WILTSHIRE COUNCIL**

Parish Councils and residents across Devizes Rural West tell me that improving our roads and transport must be an absolute priority for Wiltshire Council. I'm pleased to report that additional emphasis is being placed on these important issues with a reorganisation of Wiltshire Council Cabinet responsibilities. I have been appointed Cabinet Member for Transport and Assets, and I will work alongside Cllr Nick Holder, who has taken on responsibility for Highways, Street Scene and Flooding.

The council has allocated an extra £10m over the next two years to spend on filling potholes and a road resurfacing programme that will help to prevent potholes and other highways defects across all areas of the county. The investment will also fund more small, local repairs to verges on rural roads. This funding is in addition to the £20.7m the council receives from the Government's Highways Maintenance fund for 2024/25, plus the £5.2m from the Department for Transport's recently announced Road Resurfacing Fund following the cancellation of HS2 (northern section). The council also allocated an extra £1m in its recent budget for emptying gullies around the county to prevent flooding and enable teams to focus on problem areas that are most at risk - on top of the £1.27m the council already spends on gully emptying.

In my extended Cabinet role, I am responsible for all transport across the County including Rail, Buses and Active Travel (walking, cycling and wheeling). I will lead the Council's work on its Local Transport Plan 4 (to 2038) which will set out the council's objectives, plans and indicators for transport in Wiltshire and provide a framework for all other organisations with a direct or indirect involvement in transport in Wiltshire. I have supported the development of the brilliant Wiltshire Connect "demand responsive" bus service which now connects Devizes, Pewsey, Marlborough and Hungerford. Over the coming months I am very much looking forward to ensuring that we have more travel choices which connect our communities, enabling people to get to work, and school, and provide transport connections for people visiting the area.

Meanwhile, of course, I will work with Cllr Nick Holder and the Highways Team to secure improvements to our local roads and to accident black spots such as Black Dog and Bell Crossroads. As always, please use the MyWilts app to report highways and flooding "maintenance" issues. Whilst, requests for "improvements" should be raised with Parish Councils so that these can be taken to the Local Highways and Footpaths Improvement Group. (LHFIG)

Villages and rural areas not immune to threat of child exploitation

I was astonished to learn recently that those criminal gangs who groom and exploit children and young people to carry out criminal activities on their behalf are now using virtual rewards to take advantage of them.

This takes the form of credit in online video games, so no longer must parents only be on the look out for new trainers, designer clothes and expensive technology if they're worried their child is being exploited, but also online enticements such as avatars and virtual currency.

Children and young people are especially vulnerable to being exploited by criminal gangs because of their age and the harm caused to themselves, their families and their communities can be devastating with violent incidents often escalating. That's why my office has backed the 'Check Your Children' campaign developed by Owen's World, a charity set up by family and friends following the death of Owen Dunn who was fatally stabbed in Swindon in December 2022.

Owen was carrying a knife at the time of the stabbing, and now his family are asking parents and guardians to look out for any signs that their children may be involved in knife or gang crime.

We've developed a video to explain the signs of exploitation, the reality of serious violence in Wiltshire and where they can seek further guidance and advice if they're concerned.

We often think of drug and knife crime happening in our city and bigger towns, but our villages and more rural areas are not immune from the threat of county lines and serious violence, and sadly nor are the children and young people that live there. So, my plea to parents, guardians, grandparents, and other caregivers, please 'Check your Children' don't shy away from asking the difficult questions of your children and seeking support from schools, police, Crimestoppers and the NSPCC if you need it.

**Summer Visitors** 

House Martins: These lovely migrant birds fly from Africa to nest in the British Isles, many in our area. They spend a long time making their mud nests under the eaves of houses. Please be tolerant of their building habits. The birds do not cause too much mess and they become distressed if all their hard work is

destroyed. If house martins cannot raise their broods, yet another species will be endangered.

<u>Swallows</u>: These beautiful birds always return to their old nest sites, so please ensure access to them. If, for reasons of security, access has to be shut, swallows will fly through small openings in order to reach their traditional nesting sites.

<u>Swifts</u>: Their nesting sites, some of which are centuries old, are fast disappearing. They require an access tunnel of at least 18" long with a small entrance hole; please don't block them off. Swifts are believed to spend at much as nine months to a year on the wing, and they are known to nap whilst flying. Swift sightings can be reported to Bradford-on-Avon Swift Group at <u>climatechampions@gmail.com</u>, or <u>www.swift-conservation.org</u>.

NOTE: These birds are, of course, protected species – it is an offence to disturb or destroy their nest sites and environments. Cuckoos – should a reader wish to track cuckoo migrations there are websites which would give up-to-date progress of incoming birds, such as the BTO one.
