"Didn't we 'ave a loverly time the day we went to Wells?", to quote an old song, and we did. The day dawned bright and clear and we set off in two minibuses one from Potterne and one from Seend. Wells is such a beautiful place and we were so privileged

to be able to have our own little communion service, presided over by Revd. Gerry in the lady chapel of the cathedral .

Wells cathedral, one of the masterpieces of English architecture, and we were there not just as tourists, but as pilgrims, as so many thousands of people had been before us for 850 years. The bonus was that we had a most magnificent guided tour of the cathedral and the grounds and gardens as well. We learnt such a lot, particularly about the ancient scissor arches (which actually looked more like art nouveau) and the old fascinating medieval clock face. If you haven't been, do go, and attend a service if you can.

A picnic followed on the lawn in front of the magnificent West Front and then a walk round the market and, I must admit, a cream tea. We closed our visit with a beautiful service of Evensong in St Cuthbert's church, the church which is so familiar to Revd Caroline, and thence back home on the bus.

So, if you've been a bit afraid of the word pilgrimage, I hope I have shown you that it's a really lovely thing to do. You don't have to walk across fields barefoot, or climb medieval steps on your knees (which many pilgrims did in times gone by), but you can travel in the footsteps of our forbears and marvel at the wonder of God's creation, and man's response to it. So thank you Gerry for arranging it and leading us. I hope it will be repeated next year.

Since then, of course there has been so much activity in the benefice; gardens open, fetes, teas and all the rest of it. We live in a wonderful community, and I often reflect on the similarity between the two words, community and communion. People work so hard for the good of the community and in so doing become increasingly in communion with each other, and at the centre of all our communities are our beautiful country churches; all different, large and small, all the focus of our villages, with people using their time and talents to make sure that they will continue into the future. They are beautiful peaceful places, so if you haven't been to one of the other churches in the benefice, pop in on a hot day and feel the peace and the prayers of centuries; admire the flowers and check out the visitors book, and most particularly sit down and rest for a while, and if you can, thank God.

#### **NURTURE NATURE**

Some readers have asked where they might catch a glimpse of Crested Tits and Bearded Tits. You won't see them on your bird tables or feeders locally. One is unlikely to see the Crested Tit anywhere in the British Isles, except in Scotland. The Spey Valley pine forests provided a sanctuary for them and they have now spread to Grampian and Sutherland. For Bearded Tits go to Titchfield Haven on the Hampshire Coast. Reports so far indicate that warbler populations are down again this year. Chiffchaffs were once pretty widely spread and were one of the first species to arrive. Not so this year, so far. Hirondininae are also well down in numbers, and who has heard a Cuckoo this spring? Anyone who is lucky enough to hear a Nightingale, please post the info on your local Facebook and inform your County Orni Website. Other species of the tit family which formerly were visitors to gardens and used to enjoy the food in bird feeders are Marsh and Willow Tits, they are difficult to tell apart. Coal Tits too are in decline. On the positive side it was pleasing to see families of Long Tailed Tits on feeders during the colder spells last winter. Referring to warblers, as mentioned above with Chiffchaffs, numbers are down again this year. Blackcaps, Garden Warblers – both beautiful songsters – have hardly been heard. Warblers, such as Sedge, Reed, Willow and others formerly regularly seen on hedgerows, along water courses, in field hedgerows and woods, are in decline. As reported in previous articles, there has been a dramatic decline in bird numbers and species since the 1970s, the BTO has further reported that between 2016 and 2021 UK bird species declined by 46%. Readers can find more information and how to help to stem the tide in species decline at www.bto.org/biodiversity-loss. Should you wish to know more about how birds are faring worldwide, go to www.birdlife.org. "Everyone likes birds. What wild creature is more accessible to our eyes and ears, as close to us and everyone in the world as universal as a bird?" (Sir David Attenborough, Broadcaster). Enquiries have been made about Nightjar migrants, but these are unlikely to be seen or heard locally. Nightjars fly silently and then suddenly start clapping their wings in display and making long drawn out churring noises on warm summer nights. Staple Plain and Stock Hill Woods in the Quantocks in Somerset and the Forest of Dean in Gloucestershire have been haunts for Nightjars having migrated 6,000 kilometres from Central Africa. Still, warm nights in June are perfect for seeing and hearing Nightjars – try Staple Hill in the Blackdowns, Staple Plain in the Quantocks, Stockhill on Mendip, or Webber's Post on Exmoor. Another migrant which may be mistaken for a Nightjar, though not of the same family, is the Wryneck, a species of the Woodpecker family. However, they are becoming very rare and one would be very lucky to see one. The writer has only seen one, a juvenile, in a semi rural Wiltshire garden in the 1970s. Make Nature a happy place for us all! Otis Tarda
