In 1958, at a dance at the Assembly Rooms in Melksham, Thelma met Colin Carr, who was stationed at the RAF Station in Melksham. They were married in 1959, had two children, Michael and Jenny and two grandchildren, Ellie and Alex.

While Colin was stationed at RAF Lyneham as a flight engineer on Hercules, Thelma ran the Accounts Department at The Bear Hotel. When Colin left the RAF in 1974 he joined Cathay Pacific Airways and he and Thelma lived in Hong Kong. Thelma became a formidable businesswoman selling silverware and antiques. She had a

shrewd eye for business and travelled far and wide to acquire items. On many flights, she often escorted unaccompanied children who were returning to school in the UK. After almost 18 years in Hong Kong, Colin retired in 1992 when they returned to the UK, moving to Seend in 1995 and spending time in their house in Burgundy where they enjoyed many happy times.

In 1996 Thelma was elected to Devizes Town Council and became a Governor of Downlands School. She also served as Treasurer of Friends of Devizes Hospital for several years. In 2000, Thelma was elected to Kennet District Council and after 4 years she and Colin left to live in France for 3 years.

On their return to Seend, Thelma was re-elected to Seend Parish Council, serving for several years. She enjoyed travelling and gardening, maintaining a keen interest in politics and local issues as a leading member of Devizes Constituency Conservative Association.

Thelma sadly passed away on 18 March 2024 in Market Lavington nursing home. She will be sorely missed by her family and friends and we send our condolences to Jenny. THE SEEND LYE RECREATION FIELD.

After 9 years as Chair and with the Right of Way dispute finally resolved, I will be stepping down as Chair of the Lye Field, at the upcoming AGM on the 16th May. The organisation will therefore be looking for a new Chairperson to take over the reins. With the legal dispute concluded, the role will mainly involve chairing four quarterly meetings and one AGM each year, as well as supporting the various members of the committee with the upkeep of the facilities. The Chair is usually a Trustee of the charity that oversees the Lye Field organisation. For continuity, (if elected) I will be remaining as the charity's Treasurer, as well as a Trustee.

The Lye Field is such a valuable asset for the village, but it needs villagers' support. The Pavilion is the home of Seend Playgroup, which has been looking after and nurturing Seend kids for over 35 years. CHRISTIAN AID WEEK SUNDAY 12TH MAY - SATURDAY 18TH MAY

Christian Aid, (CA) with 70 years' experience, works to bring an end to poverty in 37 countries, via 275 projects helping people in Africa, Asia, the Middle East, Latin America and the Caribbean, addressing the root causes as well as the effects of poverty. CA raised £30.6M. in 2022-2023, working with 475 local, national & international partner organisations; some Christian, some Muslim, Jewish, Hindu or of no religious persuasion at all. CA's primary concern is that partners are good at what they do. Put simply 'aid' is what Christian Aid does, 'Christian' is why they do it. CA makes best use of monies by allocating funds from a central budget to partners according to need. A close relationship is maintained with partners to learn more about the problems in their areas, to offer support and check that money is spent wisely. Over 25% of the money collected is spent on emergencies but the key area is long term development. spending nearly half of the income on projects such as education and health as well as ways to improve people's resilience to shocks and disasters, like stronger houses in earthquake zones. The remainder is divided between campaigning and fundraising. No money is given to governments. PARC, a partner charity in Gaza, where most staff have been forcibly displaced from their homes, has reached more than 430,000 people living in shelters and with overcrowded families providing drinking water, fresh food, dried goods, blankets, nappies and hygiene kits. Those in the Wellsprings Benefice have always been generous to Christian Aid so I hope you will feel able to support Christian Aid Week once again. For your convenience, a Christian Aid envelope is inside this edition of Spotlight; please keep it safely. Collectors will call during the week of 12th- 18th May. It helps considerably if the donation is ready when they call. If you pay income tax, please complete the Gift Aid slip too, it increases your gift to Christian Aid by 25% at no extra cost to yourself. CHURCH NEWS

Just take a moment....

I wonder if like me you are someone who appreciates a quiet moment in the day to just be? Not to **do**, but simply **to be**? Sometimes it is hard to stop **doing**, it can seem like our lives and our world are moving too fast for us and we can find ourselves feeling guilty if we are not keeping pace. There are times too when others expect a lot from us, and we can also have unrealistic expectations of ourselves. The world can be a very noisy place and our inner world can become very noisy too. Perhaps that is why the practice of Mindfulness has become so popular as a tool for helping us slow down and appreciate the small things in life.

The seasons we experience within our natural world can help us to become more in tune with that which lies beyond ourselves and that which lies within us. Whether you

consider yourself to be a religious or spiritual person or not, our outer landscape can teach us a lot about our inner life as human beings.

One of the things I like to do in spring and early summer is to listen to the birdsong first thing in the morning and again at dusk. If I can I try and spot which bird is singing which song and am often surprised at the amazing sounds which come from some of the tiniest creatures! Taking time to listen to those we meet in the course of our day is important too. One of the greatest gifts we can really give someone else is a listening ear and an open heart. We can all tell if someone is interested in us and cares about us if they seek to really listen and understand us. Many of the great spiritual teachers show us how to listen, as did Jesus. Jesus regularly took time out to go off alone, often to a solitary place, to pray, to listen. He then returned better equipped to listen and minister to the needs of others.

I once picked up a helpful card at an airport 'quiet room/chapel'. I remember it was headed 'Take 5 minutes'. Sit down, 1 minute; say thank you for something, 1 minute; say sorry for something, 1 minute; pray for someone, 1 minute; pray for yourself, 1 minute. Hopefully you will have more than 5 minutes to do the above but taking 5 is better than taking nothing!

Football : Under the guidance of manager Andy Dyer, Seend won the First Division of the Trowbridge and District League, being presented with the trophy on Saturday the 13th of April when they also had to play two matches in the one day, firstly an outstanding league match followed by another cup match. They won both 1-0 which puts the team into the semi finals of the Knockout Cup. And then on a very crisp night, April 17th, Seend were in the final of the Cup played at the magnificent stadium in Melksham against Warminster. Despite Seend being the far superior team they were held 1-1 at the end of the 90 minutes having had three goals disallowed and then one of the Seend players being sent off in the final minutes of normal time for seeming to question the linesman's knowledge of the offside rule, but not his parentage. That harsh decision put Seend on the back foot during extra time although two glaring chances to put the match to bed went begging. And then with some 10 minutes remaining, against the overall run of play, Warminster scored the winner in front of a by now boisterous crowd of several hundred. That goal seemed to spark the overexcited Warminster following into some very lively celebrations and, unfortunately, a number of scuffles and the throwing of fireworks. The bar was immediately shut and indeed the bar area locked with spectators still inside. A few minutes later, as we were the first to leave the packed car park, three police cars with flashing lights turned up at the ground, too late to attend to the fracas which had now subsided, but they would have been able to enjoy the presentation ceremony which I missed as I was keen to get home and cover some heucheras which I had planted in the sunshine of the afternoon unaware of a potential overnight frost.

There is still the opportunity of further silverware as Seend play in yet another cup final, the A&B Cup in Westbury on April 23rd, and of course they are in the semi finals of the Spring Cup. STOP PRESS: They lost the semi-final 1-5 on 20th April.

<u>Athletics</u>: Seend's latest trainee lawyer, Tabitha Stockham, went to Paris on the 7th of April to run the Paris Marathon which she completed in just over 4 hours losing several toe nails on the arduous course that was run in unusually high temperatures rendering the area around the finish line resembling an A&E department on a Saturday night. Well done Tabitha!

This year's Bishops Cannings 5000m Dash, normally run in early July, has been postponed until September because of a clash of events. Full details will be in next month's Spotlight but Ric do please adhere to the training programme that I gave you. You will thank me come the big race.

SEEND PARISH COUNCIL

March PC Meeting: Attendance - Six Councillors & the Clerk

Local Council Matters

Pothole Repair: Wiltshire is investing an extra £10m into resurfacing and filling the county's potholes, in addition to £21m received annually from central Government.

The Police and Crime Commissioner Election: The Election takes place on 2 May. Wiltshire Council has provided information on their website that you need to know to vote, including photo ID and some changes to postal voting processes. Search: 'Wiltshire Police and Crime Commissioner Election Vote' for further information.

New Cabinet Responsibilities: Cllr Reay advised her Cabinet role has been extended and she is now responsible for all transport across the County - Rail, Buses, and Active Travel (walking, cycling, and wheeling). She will lead the Council's work on its Local Transport Plan 4, to ensure there are more travel choices connecting our communities, enabling people to get to work, and school, and provide transport connections for people visiting the area.

Town Centre Improvements: Wiltshire Council is working to develop projects that will attract more visitors to town centres creating wider town centre visions that will bring a range of improvements, improving vibrancy and enhancing the local economy.

Local Highways & Footpath Infrastructure Group (LHFIG)

The Bell Crossroads / Bollands Hill: Another accident at the Bell Crossroads on Friday 22nd March 2024 has been reported to Wiltshire Highways. Highways advised in a statement issued 25th March that in terms of the Annual Assessment of Collision Cluster locations, an initial list of sites for direct intervention has been developed based on the most up to date data and is currently under review by officers. This location is currently placed at 25th on the list. Until the review has been completed, Wiltshire Highways is unable to confirm whether the crossroads will be investigated further. Decision expected by the end of April.

Cllr Reay has contacted the Clerk and will be developing an action plan with the aim of developing a more proactive engagement with the Highways Engineer and Police Services. The Clerk to provide details from the parish's accident log that suggests the accident rate and type are different to those presented by Wiltshire Highways.

Bradley Lane & Rusty Lane: Before work can be undertaken in the vicinity of the canal swing bridge, several dead trees will need to be removed. Wiltshire Rights of Way (RoW) team will arrange for the trees in this area to be surveyed to identify which are to be felled. Some overgrowth along part of Bradley Lane that requires to be cut back. The RoW team will develop a proposal that improves access for all pedestrian users and cyclists whilst also minimising the change to the 'feel' of the Lane. Once developed, the RoW team will share its proposal with the Parish Council in advance of a public consultation.

Seend Community Centre is to be consulted in advance of the dates when materials and machinery will need to be delivered for storage adjacent to the Tennis Courts along with the expected date by which the need for storage will cease.

The Parish Council to share the Rights-of-Way team' proposed plans with the local horse-riding community when they become available.

Parking Spout Lane: The Clerk has requested Spout Lane Parking be added to LHFIG agenda and Cllr Reay to follow up with LHFIG.

Parking Canal Bridge: Clerk has requested the Canal Bridge Parking be added to LHFIG agenda and asked Cllr Reay to follow up with LHFIG. Cllr Reay has raised the issues caused by the increase in semi-permanent moored vessels on the canal with local MPs Danny Kruger and Michelle Donelan. Michelle Donelan is requesting a meeting with senior representatives of the Canal & River Trust in April.

Speedwatch: The Speedwatch team advised they now have their own speed camera and will be undertaking further monitoring at various locations around the parish. The preferred locations for Speed Watch Indicators (SIDs) have been sent to the Speedwatch Police Liaison Officer for approval. The Clerk has requested a project be allocated to LHFIG to install supporting street furniture.

Neighbourhood Plan

Phil Springate and the Clerk circulated two documents regarding the Neighbourhood Plan review process. Phil Springate has compiled a list of people who were involved in the development of the previous Plan. Changing the Plan will require adherence to a statutory process and he has been advised to seek professional guidance from the consultancy company (Place Studio) previously involved. Even if there are no changes, the Parish Council will need to have a consultant review the plan to ensure it complies with current legislation. The Plan will have to have completed a formal review and be reapproved no later than May 2026.

Planning Applications

The Parish Council raised no objections to the following applications: PL/2024/02164 & PL/2024/01872 - Turnpike Cottage, Inmarsh Lane, Seend – Works to a listed building & installation of an orangery at the rear of the property.

<u>Resources for Town and Parish Councils - Democratic Services - Wiltshire Council</u>

Secure Finances – Investing in Key Services: Despite the ongoing budget pressures arising from increasing demand for services and inflationary costs, the Council has been able to manage these challenges to ensure a firm financial footing. Key to this sustainable approach is to invest in services, especially those which tackle issues in a proactive way. The Council receives nearly 83% of its funding from local taxes, Business Rates and Council Tax, so we take delivering on our promises to local people very seriously.

Children's Services – Outstanding Ofsted: We want to give Wiltshire's children the best start in life as it is fundamental in improving their long-term life chances and gives them the best opportunity to live full and healthy lives. We now deliver consistently Outstanding services that ensure the needs of families and children are met. This is reflected in the Ofsted inspection report from November 2023 that rated us Outstanding across the board.

Additional Funding for Highways & Flood Prevention: Heat, flooding and severe winter weather has caused significant damage to some of Wiltshire's roads. Whilst the overall condition of Wiltshire's classified road network is better than the national average this continues to be a priority. We are investing an additional £10m in Highways maintenance, which, together with increased Department for Transport funding, will enable an extensive programme of road surfacing and treatment in 2024/25. We are also investing an additional £1m to support preventative drainage programmes and have confirmed additional £1.5m funding from 25/26 onwards to help with gully cleaning and potholes.

£179m for Adult Services, including over £9m of efficiency savings: Adult Social Care accounts for the highest percentage spend of Wiltshire Council's budget and continues to see significant demographic and cost pressures. The Transforming Adult Social Care programme ensures that the Council is proactive in ensuring services meet need. Continued investment is being made in services that support people to stay in their own homes and take full part in their communities. The Shared Lives Scheme

offers a fostering style model of care and support, and the use of Technology Enabled Care (TEC) is a key priority. Moving from children to adult services is one of the most critical times for anyone's life, especially for young adults who have Special Education Needs and Disabilities.

I continue to support Parish Councils and residents with specific local matters, and it is a pleasure to attend Parish Council meetings across the area. I will continue to press for road safety improvements across the area, especially at Black Dog and Bell Crossroads. I have helped Parishes with flooding issues access Wiltshire Council resources. NURTURE NATURE

With the Middle East wars prominent in World News, Foreign Secretaries come to mind. Many of us in our

history lessons at school remember the famous quote of Sir Edward Grey in August 1914 at the pending outbreak of the Great War. On 3rd August, having explained cogently in Parliament why Great Britain had to go to war with Germany, he returned to the Foreign Office. He remarked to his secretary 'The lamps are going out all over Europe, we shall not see them lit again in our lifetime'. As well as holding a high State office he was a countryman at heart, a great lover of Nature and an eminent ornithologist, studying robins when up at Oxford and elsewhere, and stone curlews on the family estate in Northumberland. He fed the birds at all the properties he was associated with as well as closer studies of wild fowl whilst at his fishing cottage in Hampshire. Whilst Foreign Secretary he meticulously studied the flora and fauna of St James's Park. One morning the water bailiff took Grey to see a Little Grebe's newly hatched brood. Mother Dabchick, rather concerned at the presence of humans, clucked to her chicks, which paddled over to her and all got onto her back and under her wings, and with them thus concealed she swam away to the safety of the reeds. So, it was as an ornithologist of some standing that Grey should also be remembered as he had a 'Special Relationship' with Nature. Our connection with Grey of 110 years ago, when Great Britain was at the height of her industrial power, the world's population was billions less than now and global warming would have appeared gobbledegookish with the then little studied Planet's hot and cold periods over millions of years. Why, it is robins! Some residents have noticed a decline in the

number of these iconic birds over the recent winter of extreme inclement weather, mainly due to excessive rainfall resulting in flooded habitats and environments, thereby reducing food sources and shelter over prolonged periods, more wind storms than usual wiping out early nesters and ever changing climate patterns - all have made real inroads in bird and wildlife numbers pretty well over all continents, It is our duty to do all we can to protect and regenerate our environment for wildlife. Let's hope the migrant numbers will be better this year, and the dawn choruses stronger. To assist in identifying and aiding songbirds www.songbird-survival.org.uk is a useful source. NOTE It may be of interest to know that Sir Edward Grey was the first British politician to establish the 'special relationship' with the United States, with the help of a song bird common to both Britain and the US. On a walk with the former President of the US, Theodore Roosevelt, in the New Forest, Roosevelt heard a bird song which he recognised as the bird was also a resident in his country—the tiny Gold Crested Wren! Let's trust that this 'special relationship' remains strong in helping to solve the current difficulties in the world.
