CHURCH NEWS



I'm campaigning for more funerals to be held in church! When I was ordained as a priest the Bishop said "with all God's people, you are to tell the story of God's love and minister to the sick and prepare the dying for their death". It has been my privilege to come alongside many people who are facing their final journey and with the ones who are left behind to grieve and mourn, with much discussion about the possibility of eternity. It has been my privilege to lead hundreds of Services of Remembrance and Thanksgiving for those who have been part of the communities where I

have served. It is something the church is very good at doing. It has had a lot of practice over the centuries!

But so often these days, people don't come to church for the funeral service. Maybe they mistakenly think that it will all be solemn prayers and misery, a daunting thought if a family says they are not particularly religious or regular churchgoers.

But <u>everyone</u>, religious or not, is <u>welcome</u> to have a church funeral in the place where they live and be buried (or the ashes buried) in the churchyard, which holds the history of a village. The funeral liturgy will be handled sensitively and pastorally to recognize each individual situation and holds a structure in which we can move through our emotions, express our thanksgiving and share the uniqueness of the loved one's life in poems, tributes from a family member or friend, and with significant pieces of music and songs.

I think it's important to know that the priest offers on-going pastoral care for the grieving for as long as it takes and that there are also no time constraints with the next funeral waiting at the door. And the atmosphere in church with its centuries of history, hope, faith and worship can hold us in our grief.

I recently had a discussion with a bereaved family who declared themselves not religious. But, as we talked, I learned that their mum, tho' rarely a churchgoer, had been baptized; she had talked of her loved ones as being in heaven and, possibly like all of us, had a wavering faith in the divine and eternity, feeling that there was "something there". We had an uplifting service. Her son later contacted me saying how comforting it was to have a vicar there, how the service had been a wonderful tribute to his mum and 'being in church made it all seem right and proper'.

The ritual of gathering in a holy space enables us to express the depth of our grief, celebrate and be thankful for those we love and to commit them lovingly into whatever the future holds. There are moments of intense poignancy within the funeral service, with familiar and comforting words, which enable the pain to be felt and acknowledged within a safe and peaceful environment. Yes, the church does do good funerals!

Present: Councillors P. Oakey (chair), S. Macalpine-Downie (vice-chair), J. Anderson-Hill, A Breach.

Members of Public (MOP): Wiltshire Councillors Tamara Reay & 1 MOP. Proper Officer: T. Hicks.

Recording and filming of the meeting:

The MOP confirmed they did not plan to record or film the meeting.

Apologies

Cllr. Macapline-Downie gave their reasons for absence and it was UNANIMOULSY RESOLVED to accept these reasons.

Declarations of Interest

There were no declarations of interest received.

Minutes of the previous meeting

The minutes of the parish council meeting held on 11th June 2025 were APPROVED UNANIMOUSLY.

Public Participation

To enable members of the public to address the Council regarding any item on the agenda.

- The MOP asked if the telephone box could be moved to within the village rather than in the play area. It was UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED to ACTION: Clerk to investigate options.
- The MOP asked if there was the possibility of the planting of a wildflower verge and if there was grant funding available. The MOP was asked to apply for the grant funding via the relevant form.
- The MOP asked if they could hold a fete on the William Breach field. The clerk advised them to send more details to see what the Parish Council could help with.
- The MOP asked if the Parish Steward could attend to the weeds within the pavements. The clerk advised that she would pass on their request.

There were no petitions or deputations received.

Reports

The members received an update from Wiltshire Councillor – Cllr. Reay.

• Cllr Reay advised the meeting with news of the proposed safety improvements at Black Dog crossing near Worton (C20) and at Caen Hill. Traffic lights work at Black Dog crossroads would be starting this week. Road closures and restrictions would continue until February 2026. To keep up to date, please visit www.wiltshire.gov.uk/highways-road-closures.

There was no chair's report.

The members received the up-to-date external meetings.

Planning Matters to discuss

To note any applications received before the meeting. None.

To note the BPC Planning Schedule as at 1st September 2025. Noted.

Maintenance

The council discussed and agreed parish steward jobs for next visit – to tackle the vegetation growing through the kerb stones on the pavements and to clear around the village entrance signs.

The council discussed winter preparations (salt bin requirements etc). It was deemed not necessary to request more provisions from Wiltshire Council.

The council discussed moving road signs:-

Children crossing warning signs. A resident had reported that they had been injured on the Children Crossing sign. It was UNANIMOULSY RESOLVED to ACTION: Clerk to report to Wiltshire Council to ask it to be raised higher. Also to change the 'School' sign to be changed to be something more relevant as there is no school in the village.

Bulkington Village entrance signs and enhancing these. After discussion it was UNANIMOULSY AGREED to request new signs and white gates from LHFIG. ACTION: Clerk and Cllr. Anderson-Hill to identify possible sites, complete the application and carry forward to October meeting for further discussion. See above.

Finance

There were no invoices/requests for payment received prior to the meeting.

Monthly Management Accounts

Members received the monthly financial report and bank reconciliation. A non-

signatory member to sign the bank reconciliation and bank statements. Cllr. Anderson-Hill signed the accounts. As all Councillors are now bank signatories, anyone will be able to sign the accounts, it was UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED to ACTION: The clerk to amend the Financial Regulations to reflect this change and bring to the next meeting for adoption.

Annual Governance & Accountability Return 2024-25. The council discussed and noted the conclusion of the audit.

Budget and Precept 2026-27

Members received and discussed first draft of the proposed budget and precept requirements for 2026-27. Carry forward to next meeting.

NJC Salary Scales 2025-26. Members noted the new NJC Salary Scales 2025-26.

Playground & Grounds

Members received an update on the playground maintenance. After discussion it was UNANIMOUSLY AGREED that the zipwire is uneconomical to repair and must be removed. ACTION: Clerk to arrange and suggest replacements at the next meeting. Also to apply for National Lottery grant funding. Clerk to obtain further quotes to repair the wood on the tunnel.

Telephone Box

The council discussed the options for moving the telephone box and it was UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED to ACTION: Clerk to investigate land ownership, phone box listing and more details for further discussion.

Governance

2025 - Housing Development Proposal for land west of Spout Lane

Introduction by Cllr Savage

Cllr Savage confirmed that Gaigers approached the Parish Council, following the engagement protocols set out in the Seend Neighbourhood Plan seeking to discuss:

- The Parish Council view on the current Neighbourhood Plan and whether there were plans to review and update this
- Explain the initial reasoning for Gaiger interest in this land
- Discuss Gaiger's potential approach to engaging with the local community

Presentation by Sam Gaiger and Nick Church from Gaiger Brothers

Sam Gaiger and Nick Church confirmed that they had initially expected a preliminary meeting with Cllrs to consider the above but welcomed the chance to attend and listen to early feedback from the community.

Gaigers remain at the early stage of the detailed site assessment stage, with several surveys to follow ahead of looking at potential site layouts and designs. Accordingly, there are limited details available now, but Gaigers were always intending to hold a full consultation event when more information is available expected to follow in September/October and to be advertised in advance.

Nick Church confirmed Gaigers have been in discussions with the landowner regarding a potential housing development for approximately 12–18 months.

Land Size: The landowner agreement covers a wider area (c5 acres) but the expectation is that any built development is likely to be limited to 1-2 acres and could deliver somewhere between 5-20 houses.

Site Location: Seend has been chosen due to the housing targets identified in the emerging Wiltshire Council Local Plan. The Wiltshire Council Local Plan has identified the need for 23 new homes within Seend in the period from 2022 to 2038. In addition to this, Wiltshire Council is also required to prepare a further review of the Local Plan to accommodate further housing development which could include a higher number than the 23 identified at Seend.

Neighbourhood Plan (NP): Gaigers have reviewed the current Seend Neighbourhood Plan and supporting documents. The Neighbourhood Plan does not allocate land specifically for housing but does contain relevant planning policies that any development needs to carefully consider. During the Neighbourhood Plan site assessment process, the site under discussion was rated more positively than alternative locations.

Housing Proposal: Gaigers expect that the proposal will be for an open market housingled development, with provision for affordable housing. Further work is required to review housing needs and inform the size and type of housing

Public Engagement: Public questions and discussion continued for approximately an hour. Several topics and issues were raised including impacts on the conservation area and the Grade 2 Listed Egypt Farmhouse, access and highways impacts on the High Street, Spout Lane and more generally, drainage and flood risk concerns, impacts on local views and biodiversity, impacts on neighbouring houses both in terms of privacy and potential impacts on house values. Questions were also asked challenging why housing is required in Seend on greenfield land, why not on brownfield land in local larger towns. Questions were also raised about the expected architectural design and what sustainability / net-zero commitments would be proposed.

Nick Church noted the feedback from residents and confirmed Gaigers reflect on the points raised. He also committed to arranging a further community engagement session to continue the dialogue. This is likely to follow in September/October, subject to the completion of ongoing survey work, arranging a venue and notifying the local community in advance.

Meeting Conduct: During the session, a resident raised concerns. The Clerk addressed the individual's conduct, reminding everyone that the meeting should be respectful and considerate of all parties involved including the contractor, the Parish Council, and neighbouring residents.

UPDATE FROM WILTSHIRE COUNCIL

Support for Rural Businesses

There are many fabulous businesses and other organisations providing vital services across Devizes Rural West and this month I want to highlight the Rural Hubs grant scheme, aimed at supporting businesses, social enterprises, charities, and organisations offering essential services in smaller rural areas.

The funding is designed to improve important services in rural areas, such as shops, cafés, healthcare and other local services. The Rural Hubs grant will help organisations in smaller rural areas set up new services and facilities or improve existing ones. It aims to provide new or improved access to services, increase a sense of community, and strengthen community cohesion.

The grant can be used for things like refurbishment, or establishing new premises, buying equipment, tools; investing in digital technology to enhance services; and developing infrastructure for access, such as increasing capacity and opening times. However, grants are for capital costs only and so cannot be used for salaries, volunteer costs, restocking, operational and day-to-day expenditure, or replacing existing equipment.

Grant amounts start from £2,500, with no upper limit. For economic activities driven by income, such as farm shops and pubs, applicants must provide at least 40% of the total investment costs. For non-economic activities, such as cultural activities, applicants must provide at least 25% of the total investment costs.

To be eligible for the Rural Hubs grant, organisations must be a registered company, registered charity, mutual benefit society, charitable trust, industrial and provident society, or farm partnership. More information is online at <u>Business Fit for Future: supporting businesses in Wiltshire</u>. Please let me know if you need any help making an application.

There are also several other grant schemes – funded by the UK Shared Prosperity Fund, including grants for Start Ups, grants for Growing Businesses, and Fit for Net Zero – grants and support for businesses and community organisations investing in energy efficiency and sustainability. Please do take a look.

Finally, several residents have asked me about the continuing closure of Northgate Street, following the kebab shop fire in Devizes. I know that the road closure is incredibly frustrating. It adds to traffic issues around the area, especially for those of us coming into Devizes from the Caen Hill and Bath Road direction, has affected retail businesses in the town and drivers use Whistley Road to try to save time. Unfortunately, the building was badly damaged, but as you may know, 2 Northgate Street is listed, and a planning application is now being considered for demolition. You can read more detail on the Wiltshire Council website at PL/2025/06228. I hope for everyone's benefit that this planning decision can be made as soon as possible. I will keep you posted.
