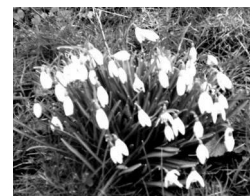

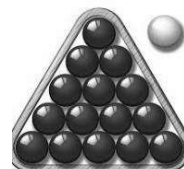

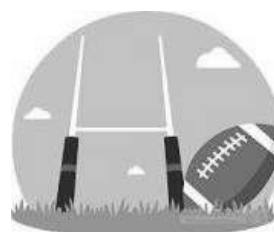

Recording and filming of the meeting - There were no MOP present.

Minutes of the previous meeting - The minutes of the parish council meeting held on 12th November 2025 were APPROVED UNANIMOUSLY.

SEEND THEATRE CLUB



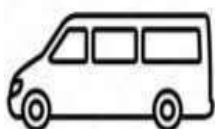

Updates from Cllr Raey

Community Governance Review

Wiltshire Council undertakes a Community Governance Review periodically to ensure that arrangements for parishes ensure that they best reflect the identity and interests of local communities. It helps ensure that governance arrangements are as effective and convenient as they can be. It can involve adjustments to the number of parish council councillors, parish boundaries, name changes etc.

The round of reviews covers the parishes within the Devizes, Marlborough and Royal Wootton Bassett & Cricklade Area Boards. In the first instance, the Parish Council should consider the questions covered in the briefing note and feed back to Democratic Services. Any changes will take effect from the next scheduled election on 1 May 2029. Also to note that I am Vice Chairman of the Electoral Review Committee, which is overseeing this process, so I am well-placed to follow up on any issues that arise.

Freight in Seend High Street

I am advised that Wiltshire Council will publish its draft Freight Strategy in Spring 2026. I have shared with Highways Officers the recent traffic counts, which showed that significantly more freight is using the High Street, rather than the advisory A365 route. However, I am keen that Seend's issue is highlighted to Cabinet Members and Councillors, and I have suggested to Steve Vaux and Paul Taylor that a formal question is submitted to Full Council in February, and I am liaising with them on this.

Wiltshire Local Plan

The next stage in the Local Plan process is a series of formal hearings by the Planning Inspector. However, I understand that following the initial hearings, future hearings have been postponed by the Inspector to allow further work to be completed. More information is at [Wiltshire Local Plan Examination](#)

The draft Local Plan deemed Seend to be a large Village - but this was just Seend itself and not the other connected settlements - as a large village, Seend's Housing Growth (2020-2038) was calculated at 27. Seend Parish Council made the "Whole Parish" point at the Regulation 19 Consultation and this is noted in the Regulation 22(1)(c) Consultation Statement published in September 2024. I am following up with officers about when this point will be formally considered.

Bell Crossroads

Thank you to residents for notifying Hayley about collisions at Bell Crossroads. I have discussed the latest incident with Highways Officers, and I am advised that the circumstances of the collision are significantly different to those previously seen, relating to vehicles exiting the side roads. In this circumstance, both vehicles were on the main road, with one attempting to make a turn.

Highways Officers advise that the monitoring period for the work that was previously undertaken at Bell Crossroads is ongoing. It would be helpful if the Parish Council could correlate details it holds on collisions at Bell Crossroads with those recorded by the Police as injury collisions – this information is at [CrashMap - UK Road Safety Map](#)

Local Highways and Footpath Improvement Group

NEWS FROM WILTSHIRE COUNCIL

More Bad News, I'm Afraid

The title of my first article for 2026 was "All Change with Waste, and not for the Better!" – I am very sorry to say that I understand that Wiltshire Council is proposing further disappointing and destructive cuts in the 2026/27 Annual Budget which will affect residents in Devizes Rural West.

Firstly, the proposed Parking Plan is bad news for residents and businesses because it introduces a 20% rise in parking charges, along with extended chargeable hours from 7am–7pm and new or reinstated Sunday fees, which will deter visitors from town centres. This is likely to discourage people from visiting Devizes and other towns, for shopping and leisure and could especially harm hospitality businesses. Especially when businesses in Devizes have suffered from the impacts of traffic and the continued Northgate Street closure. It is clear to me that the plan risks undermining economic vitality rather than supporting it. I understand that once the Lib Dem Cabinet agrees the changes, that it is planning a "consultation" in the Spring – and I would encourage all residents to make their views known.

Secondly, the Lib Dems are proposing to cut funding to the much-needed Link and Community Transport schemes which are run by volunteers across Wiltshire including the Worton & Marston Link, Devizes & District Link, Seend Link and Seend Community Bus. As you may know Link is volunteer-run community transport service supporting people who are elderly, disabled, isolated, or temporarily unwell. Volunteers use their skills and vehicles to help with essential trips such as medical appointments and shopping - and is vital for residents in rural areas where bus services are limited. Frankly, I am appalled at the proposal to cut this funding – in fact, when I was Cabinet Member for Transport, I made sure that Community Transport was properly funded and supported by Wiltshire Council, as it is a vital part of our bus strategy and without it, many vulnerable residents will be unable to reach important medical appointments in rural areas. I understand that this terrible proposal will be part of the Budget Setting Full Council meeting on 24 February and I would encourage everyone to make their views known by emailing Martin Smith, Cabinet Member for Transport martin.smith@wiltshire.gov.uk

Another cut is proposed to the Parish Emergency Assistance Scheme (PEAS) which provides vital cold-weather and flooding support to town and parish councils by supplying essential equipment such as salt, gel sacs, tabards, and flood-warning signs to help communities respond during severe weather. Cutting funding will undermine local resilience, leaving parishes less prepared for snow and flood events and reduce their ability to protect vulnerable residents.

These proposals will be discussed at the Full Council meeting in Trowbridge on Tuesday 24 February – I am preparing to speak to highlight the impact on residents and Parish Councils in Devizes Rural West, so please do let me know if there are points that you would like me to make on your behalf. Thank you.
